## Talk Sup Week 38 Review and Preview

June 1, 2020

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a nice and relaxing weekend. Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Review and Preview*.

As per my Off Day Update email to the community last Saturday (click [here](#) to see it), based upon the guidance or lack thereof provided by Governor Murphy and the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE), we have decided to continue with our plans for providing intimate individual graduation ceremonies to all of Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) graduating seniors on either June 8<sup>th</sup> or 9<sup>th</sup>. However, as I noted, if we receive reliable information that would make us confident that we could hold a ceremony for the entire Class of 2020 in July, we will consider it.

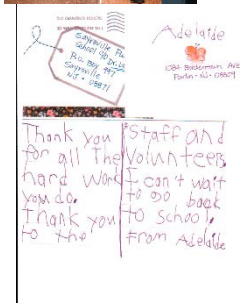
As I also included in my broadcast email on Saturday, we have yet to receive any direction on in-person summer school programming. However, as far as extended school year (ESY) is concerned, we will only be providing services for students with disabilities who, based upon what is stipulated in their individualized education programs (IEP), are eligible for ESY. While there is a possibility that we will be able to provide these services in-person, it is much more likely that they will be delivered either virtually or in a hybrid combination of virtual and in-person instruction. With regard to Summer Enrichment, if we are able to provide it in-person, we will examine the social distancing requirements for it, and make a determination on whether we will hold it this summer. However, even if we do determine that we can hold it, based upon the Governor's restrictions on the opening of summer camps, its start date will need to be revised from June 29<sup>th</sup> to July 6<sup>th</sup>.



Because of the success we experienced last week with the vehicle drive-up and drop/pick-up process for our 12<sup>th</sup> graders at SWMHS, we will duplicate the same process for our 8<sup>th</sup> graders at the middle school this upcoming week. We will complete the vehicle drive-up and drop/pick-up process during the week of June 8<sup>th</sup> for all remaining students at the high school and middle school, along with all students in the upper elementary school, K-3 elementary schools, and preschool.



Schedules and specific details for these plans, particularly the social distancing guidelines that will be required, will be distributed sometime this week by each respective school's administration. Please remember that since our students and staff will still be participating in virtual instruction through June 11<sup>th</sup>, all educational devices that were loaned out, will be collected on June 12<sup>th</sup>.



As they have been since the beginning of the pandemic, our amazing group of Operation BStrongSayreville volunteers once again prepared and delivered nearly 3,000 meals, many devices, countless student work packets, and toilet paper, paper towels, and tissues for anyone who needed such last week. Since we will **return** to our schedule of delivering breakfast/lunches on **Mondays** and **Wednesdays** until **June 10<sup>th</sup>**, which will be our **last** delivery day of the year, we are asking parents to order for two days at a time for Monday and Tuesday, and three days at a time for Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. As per it, remember that we are also allowing community members to refill one 12-ounce container of hand sanitizer in the main vestibule of SWMHS from 8 am – 12 pm on Mondays and Wednesdays.
