Talk Sup Week 5 Review and Preview

October 7, 2019

Good morning Sayreville. I hope you had a relaxing weekend. Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Week Review and Preview*. Please remember that we will be **dismissing our students early this afternoon** so that our staff can participate in professional development. In addition, please do not forget that our **schools will be closed on Wednesday** in observance of Yom Kippur.

Last Tuesday, the Superintendent Parent Advisory Council (SPAC) and Blue Ribbon Committee met to discuss the district's proposed facilities strategic action plan, which includes a potential referendum. During the meeting, both committees provided candid feedback about the district's strategic plan, as well as on my presentation that will be given to all staff and the parents of all our students. In addition, they provided me with feedback about the survey that all members of the Sayreville community will be asked to complete on November 4th with regard to both the strategic action plan and referendum. The only other matter that was discussed during the meeting was the traffic on Washington Road in the morning, which is resulting in some parents of middle school students unsafely allowing their children out of their vehicles on Washington Road, others to cut through the high school to bypass some of the traffic, and yet other vehicles going in the wrong direction in order to get into the middle school parking lot. According to Mr. Jegou, Assistant Principal at the middle school, the traffic is a little more than most years, but should dissipate over time as the parents of some students become more comfortable with their children walking to school.

Last Wednesday evening, I had the privilege of attending the Eisenhower PTO Meeting. During it, I presented to the parents and staff members in attendance the district's aforementioned proposed facilities strategic plan, particularly the options for a potential referendum, which among other improvements, includes the installation of air conditioning. This week I will be presenting to the staff at Eisenhower and the middle school, and to the parents at the Truman Elementary School. In addition to these meetings and those noted below, I will also be making the same presentation during the October 15th BOE Business Meeting.


