Good afternoon Sayreville! I hope you had a most relaxing and enjoyable summer. That being said, I would like to begin my first edition this year by once again welcoming all our staff, students and parents back to what we hope will be yet another exciting, successful, and memorable school year for you and your children. As per the emails that I sent out on Sunday, please remember that school will officially begin for all students in grades 1-12 tomorrow (Thursday, September 5, 2019). Students in preschool and kindergarten

will have their respective **orientations tomorrow** (**Thursday**) **afternoon**, but will **start school** the following day on **Friday**, **September 6**, **2019**. However, please also remember that if your child is entering **preschool**, **Kindergarten**, or **6**th **grade**, they will **NOT** be able to start school without up to date immunizations.

Therefore, if you did not upload your updated immunization certificate when you performed your enrollment update, you **MUST** submit them to your child's school prior to September **5**th if your child will be in **6**th grade or September **6**th if your child will be in preschool or kindergarten. In addition, please remember that a schedule of approximate bus stop pick up and drop off times has been **posted** on the **Transportation page of our website**. To get to that page, click **here**. If your child(ren) take a **van** rather than a bus, the driver of the van should have contacted and informed you of the estimated times of pick-up and drop-off. As always, please be patient with regard to bussing during the first couple of weeks of school, especially tomorrow. Finally, if you have not done so already, make sure that you visit the <u>Parent Page</u> of our website (<u>www.sayrevillek12.net</u>), as it consists of an abundance of information that you will find very helpful, particularly the <u>2019-20 School District Calendar</u>, <u>September Head of the Class Calendar</u> and the <u>2019-20 Our Schools Guide</u>, which were sent out and posted last week.


