Talk Sup Week 9 Review and Preview

November 4, 2019

Good morning Sayreville. I hope you had a relaxing weekend. Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Week Review* and *Preview*.

Last Tuesday morning and evening, I had the privilege of attending the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) Coffee with the Principal Meetings. During them, I presented to the parents and staff members in attendance the district's proposed facilities strategic plan, particularly the options for a potential referendum, which among other improvements, includes the installation of air conditioning. Likewise, I visited and gave the same presentation to the faculty and staff at the Wilson Elementary School last Tuesday afternoon. On November 17th, we will close the survey so that we can collect and analyze the data in preparation for a presentation that we will make to the Board of Education on November 19th. On November 13th, we will also provide preliminary data from the Survey to the SPAC and Blue Ribbon Committee during our joint meeting scheduled for that evening at 7 pm.
