#### Week 15 Talk Sup Review and Preview

December 17, 2018

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable weekend. In addition, I hope our Jewish families had a very happy Hanukah! Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Review and Preview*.

Last Wednesday evening the Superintendent's Parent Advisory Council (SPAC) met in the Selover Conference Room. We began the meeting by giving updates on transportation, pests, and by reviewing the data collected from the Springboard Education Before and After School Care Survey that we asked our parents to complete several weeks ago. During the meeting we also briefly discussed the arrest of the Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) staff member. Dr. Labbe strongly conveyed that despite this incident, the children in Sayreville are working with the most child centered, hard-working, and dedicated people that he has ever had the privilege of working with during his 24 years of service in education. Likewise, he discussed the principal vacancy at SWMHS due to the well-deserved retirement of Mr. Brown, and the plans that the district has developed to identify both his short-term and long-term replacement.

In addition, Dr. Labbe provided an update to the Council on the measures that the district has and will continue to take this and next year to enhance school safety and security, which includes the potential hiring of a School Safety and Security Specialist in February; the construction of secure retention vestibules at SWMHS,



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Sayreville Middle School (SMS), and the Samsel Upper Elementary School (SUES) this summer, and at Eisenhower, Truman, Wilson, and Arleth during the summer of 2019; the installation of metal detectors at all schools beginning this January; and the installation of student swipe kiosks, along with the implementation of procedures to use them to screen all students at the high school and middle school later this school year. He also discussed preparations for the 2019-20 Budget, which includes the district's strategic plan for renovating and refurbishing district facilities, such as using this and future budgets to replace and repair windows and roofs, beginning with the Eisenhower School this year; using Energy Saving Improvement Program (ESIP) monetary incentives to replace lighting and mechanicals; and the development of a potential referendum to transform the Selover School into a preschool, construct a bus and buildings and grounds compound, and to install solar panels. If you are unfamiliar with ESIP, it is a program that was created for government agencies, like school districts, to make energy related improvements. Under Chapter 4 of the Laws of 2009 (the law), the "Energy Savings Improvement Program" (ESIP), provides all government agencies in New Jersey with a flexible tool to improve and reduce energy usage with minimal expenditure of new financial resources.

Lastly, Dr. Shediack, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction, answered a question with regard to when the school counselors at the high school begin and how they prepare Sayreville War Memorial (SWMHS) students for the college application process. Mr. Glock-Molloy, Assistant Superintendent of Information, Technology, and Operations, and Mr. Gluchowski, Sayreville Middle School Principal, also addressed an inquiry about what the district does to thwart students from smoking or vaping in bathrooms at the middle and high schools. Lastly, Mr. Gluchowski and Dr. Labbe responded to questions about the amount of time children, particularly in grades K-8, have to eat lunch after waiting in lines to purchase it. In fact, for the SPAC meeting on January 9<sup>th</sup>, Dr. Labbe will ask the Director and Assistant Director of Food Services to attend.



This week our amazing students continued to impress and inspire us with their accomplishments in and out of the classroom. Throughout the past several weeks the students at all our schools impressed us with their vocal and instrumental talents while performing in school or community concerts. Naturally, our incredibly talented high



school and middle school choirs and bands were remarkable during their respective Holiday Concerts on December 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>. In the elementary schools, on December 6<sup>th</sup> the Truman School 3rd Grade Chorus performed magnificently for the Middlesex County Retired Teachers Association at the Grand Marquis. The



Eisenhower School 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Chorus also gave a wonderful performance during their December 6<sup>th</sup> Holiday Concert. Likewise, the Arleth Elementary School Chorus "brought down the house" during their concert on December 11<sup>th</sup>.
