#### Talk Sup Week 34 Review and Preview

As I indicated last week, May is National Educator Appreciation Month and last week was Teacher Appreciation Week. However, in last week's Talk Sup I failed to let you know that along with National Teacher Appreciation Day last Tuesday and National School Nurses Appreciation Day last Wednesday, last Monday was also the New Jersey Education Association School Bus **Driver Appreciation Day.** Therefore, we commend all of our hard-working, dedicated, and exemplary bus drivers and bus aides in Sayreville. More importantly, we thank them for extreme

care and pride that they take in safely transporting over 4,000 of our children each day to and from school. They ROCK!



Last Friday, I had the honor and privilege to attend the Class of 2019 Senior Prom, which was held at the South Gate Manor in Freehold. Words cannot accurately express how impressed I was with all our young women and men who attended. Moreover, based upon the incredibly positive feedback that we received about them, I must share with you how proud we are of all of them. In fact, the general manager of the Manor, who is also an educator in Wall

Last Wednesday evening the Superintendents Parent Advisory Council met for the last time during 2018-19. The meeting, which was open to the public, began with the discussion of old news. As such, it reviewed the major highlights of the 2019-20 School District Budget, discussed Mr. Dale Rubino becoming the next Principal at SWMHS, and talked about revising high school policy in order to award students at SWMHS who participate in the fall drama and spring musicals, concert band, and possibly Odyssey of the Mind, with varsity letters.

Dr. Labbe also notified the Council that the Board of Education decided that the staff and students at the high school and middle school will not be required to make up the day school was closed on April 8th due to a water main break on Washington Road, and that it approved a revision to the 2018-19 School District Calendar, which would make the last day of school for students Friday, June 21st. As a result, he noted that Friday, June 21st will be the new date for the SWMHS Graduation Commencement Ceremony, and Thursday, June 20th will be the new date for the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) Promotion Ceremony. As always, both ceremonies will be held in the SWMHS Stadium at 6 pm. Speaking of the high school graduation commencement and middle school promotion ceremonies, Dr. Labbe informed the Council that the district will implement the same security procedures for both activities this year. Thus, no bags, other than clutch wallets or purses that fit in the palm of a hand, will be permitted into either, unless the spectator is the parent of an infant or toddler, is elderly, or has serious medical conditions. Additionally, spectators will not be permitted to bring into the stadium air horns.

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In addition, Dr. Labbe reported to the Council that next year the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) would be implementing a Junior National Honor Society program. He also discussed fundraising and reminded the Council that such cannot be required in order for a student to participate in any school sponsored activity, including a banquet. Furthermore, he reminded the Council that the next Sayreville Parent University workshop will take place on Monday, May 13<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm at the Sayreville Police Department Headquarters and will feature a presentation by the Sayreville Police Department on "Hidden Dangers in the Home." Likewise, a Council member reminded those in attendance about the Parents of Autistic Children (POAC) Walk, which will take place from 11 am – 2 pm in the SWMHS Stadium on Saturday, May 24<sup>th</sup>.



While I did not have the opportunity to attend, last week SMS hosted a Title 1 and ASI Family Literacy Night. Many students and parents took the time to participate in this celebration of literacy that was designed by the amazing ASI and English teachers at the middle school in order to promote reading. Moreover, the parents and students who attended this wonderful activity learned how reading can be a formative family experience while also an enriching literary adventure. We extend our

sincere appreciation to Ms. Grossman, Supervisor of Language Arts, Mr. Gluchowski and the middle school administration, and of course all our wonderful middle school ASI and English teachers who took part in making this activity so special.

If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education Business Meeting held on Tuesday, May 7<sup>th</sup>, here is what you missed. During the presentation portion of the meeting, Dr. Labbe presented the major highlights of the 2019-20 School District Budget as part of the required Budget Public Hearing. The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved all of them. To see the Agenda click <u>here</u>. To see the Agenda Addendum click <u>here</u>. Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the Board approved the Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020. In addition, it approved professional service contracts for the 2019-20 school year.

On the Student Achievement portion of the agenda, the Board of Education approved co-curricular clubs and activities, including but not limited to the creation of a Volleyball Club at the SWMHS and the inception of a National Junior Honor Society at the Sayreville Middle School during the 2019-20 school year. On the Governance portion of the agenda, among other motions, the BOE approved a motion to not require the students and staff of the Sayreville Middle School and Sayreville War Memorial High School to make up the school day missed on April 8, 2019 due to a water main break. Likewise, it also approved a motion to revise the 2018-19 School District Calendar in order to make June 19<sup>th</sup> a half day and June 21<sup>st</sup> the last day of school for students. Furthermore, this change will now make the date of the Sayreville Middle School Promotion Ceremony, Thursday, June 20<sup>th</sup> and the SWMHS Graduation Commencement Ceremony Friday, June, 21<sup>st</sup>. To see the calendar, click here. Lastly, the Board approved the First Reading of several new and revised BOE policies and regulations. To see them, click here.

Finally, on the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education accepted the retirement of Diane Hayes and Tremaine Lieberman, Cafeteria Workers, Maureen Proudman, Confidential Secretary, and Carmen Davis, Principal, effective July 1, 2019. It also appointed new certificated and non-certificated staff for the 2018-19 and 2019-20 school years, the transfer of a non-certificated staff member for the



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remainder of the 2018-29 school year, and the approval of coaches and advisors and their stipends for the 2019-20 school year. In addition, it appointed personnel to perform Summer IEP work from June 26, 2019 through August 31, 2019, certificated and non-certificated staff to work during Camp XL (Extended School Year Program) from July 8, 2019 through August 8, 2019, and teachers to write the curriculum as listed for implementation in the 2019-2020 school year. Lastly, the BOE approved the Secretarial Summer Hours (2019) Sidebar Agreement between the Sayreville Board of Education and the Sayreville Education Association.

During the Public Comment portion of the meeting a community member expressed her concern and disappointment with the proposed 2019-20 School District Budget.

During the Open Discussion portion of the meeting Mr. Ciak reviewed what was discussed during the last New Jersey School Boards Association Delegates Assembly Meeting. In addition, Mr. Esposito inquired about when the new student identification card swipe system will be implemented in the district. Dr. Labbe informed him and the Board that due to the fact that the district will not receive the IDs until later this month, it will be implemented during the 2019-20 school year.
