district might be forced to close, delay opening, and dismiss early due to dangerous weather conditions. As you know, decisions to alter the school day are always very carefully considered and are particularly difficult given the fact that many parents still have to report to their respective jobs. Therefore, while our incredible custodial, grounds, and maintenance staff will be hard at work removing the snow with the Sayreville Borough workers on inclement weather days, we may get too much to safely open schools on time or at all. Hence, please plan in advance NOW for potential delayed openings or school closings.

Among other things, your preparations should include:

- Having contingency plans in place for child care if schools are closed for the day, dismissed early, or delay in opening.
- Having a secondary plan in place in case roads between your home and your workplace are closed.
- Ensuring that your contact information, including email addresses and cell phone numbers, as well as that of your delegated emergency contacts, is accurate and current.
