If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education (BOE) Business Meeting held on Tuesday, December 19th, here is what you missed. Dr. Labbe began the presentation portion of the meeting by asking Mr. Ciak to assist him and the Board in recognizing and honoring the outstanding service to the Sayreville Public Schools that Mr. Michael Macagnone and Mrs. Beth DePinto provided while serving



on the Board of Education for the past several years. Next. Dr. Labbe asked Ms. Hill, Business Administrator, and Ms. Jenkins, Director of Food Services, to present the proposed 2018-19 Food Services Budget. To see their presentation, click here.



The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved them all. To see the Agenda click here. To see the Agenda Addendum click here. Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the Board graciously accepted a generous donation of earbuds at an estimated value of \$5,328 from Allegiance Retail Services in Iselin, New Jersey. In addition, it awarded the student information software request for proposal (RFP), which will be fully operational and integrated by July 1, 2018 for the 2018-19 school year through the 2022-2023 school year, to Oncourse. Finally the BOE approved a royalty agreement with JSJD Media, LLC d/b/a School Revenue Partners for participation in a school district advertising program from January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018.

Furthermore, on the Student Achievement portion of the agenda, the Board approved several new courses for the 2018 – 2019 school year at SWMHS, such as Advanced Jazz Studies, Communicating in the 21st Century, Everyday Algebra, and others. It also approved co-curricular activities, including but not limited to the Arleth School Science Family Fun Night on Friday, January 5, 2018; and the Samsel Upper Elementary School (SUES) ASI Family Reading Night on Monday, April 16, 2018 from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm.

Likewise, on the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education accepted the retirement of Linda Kudrak, Part-Time Secretary at the Eisenhower Elementary School, effective January 1, 2018. It also appointed new certificated and non-certificated staff for the 2017-18 school year, including Michael Salum, who returns to Sayreville, where he was born and raised, as the new Supervisor of Social Studies, Related Arts and Extra Curricular Activities.

During the public comment portion of the meeting, a parent expressed her concerns about the new Grades 3-5 Standards-Based Report Card and her disappointment in the manner in which the district implemented it this fall. After that, another parent expressed his concerns about harassment, intimidation, and bullying at



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the middle school and inquired about how the district was addressing it. Finally, a community member and former BOE member complimented and thanked Mrs. DePinto and Mr. Macagnone for their devout service to the school district and greater Sayreville community.

During open discussion, each Board of Education member took the time to commend and thank Mrs. DePinto and Mr. Macagnone for their service to the school district. After that, Mrs. Batko reviewed what was discussed during the last BOE Finance Committee Meeting, as did Mr. Biesiada, and Mrs. DePinto with regard to the last BOE Buildings and Grounds and Student Achievement Committee Meetings respectively. Finally, Mr. Ciak summarized the National School Boards Association visit and board meeting in Sayreville on December 4th and thanked the staff and administration for all they did to make it a grand success. He also commented about how the new federal tax bill, recently approved by the legislature and President, would adversely impact public education.
