amazing display of early childhood athletics, sportsmanship, and inclusion by all the children that participated. Thus, we commend and congratulate Audrey Burns, Supervisor of Project Before, for coordinating this amazing event, as well as all the preschool children who participated and their wonderful teachers who supported them, especially Michael Ballo, the preschool Physical Education Teacher, who facilitated the meet. Kathleen impressed Jamie Librot, Sabert Director of Talent Management, and the other members of the Sabert Scholarship selection committee with her amazing essay, which compared the cosmological String Theory with caring for a loved one with Autism. Since Kathleen, who is also the 2018 SWMHS Valedictorian, will be studying bio chemistry at Duke University in North Carolina for the next four years, she will receive \$5,000 from Sabert for each year. Sabert, which has been a remarkably generous community partner since they settled in Sayreville, has been giving out scholarships to our students for over 15 years.



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In addition, the school district was recently informed by Caryn Berman from the Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE), which is a non-profit organization promoting international education and exchange that was founded in 1947 and is based in Portland, Maine, that three SWMHS students have been granted



substantial scholarships from CIEE in order for them to travel to some amazing places this summer, where



they will study abroad. Jennifer Lotenberg, Grade 11, will be traveling to Dublin, Ireland for a three-week program on Global Entrepreneurship. Additionally, Jovan Alcantaro, Grade 9, will travel to Botswana in order to participate in three-weeks of a wildlife conservation program. Lastly, Hussain Zaidi, a 9th grader, will travel to Guanajuato, Mexico in order to participate in a program entitled, "Creating Change through Solidarity."



In athletics, this past weekend our SWMHS Girls Track Team continued their dominance in the Central Jersey Group 4 Track and Field Championships. Jasmine Vannote was crowned the Girls Central Jersey Group 4 Shot Put Champion with a school record throw of 42.3.
