Superintendent's Letter - March 2017

Dear San Mateo-Foster City Community,

The San Mateo–Foster City School District is excited about the release of the **California School Dashboard**, a new state accountability system. This Dashboard presents

multiple measures of student achievement and progress in a composite format for schools and districts. By using multiple measures, and representing both status and growth, a more complete picture is presented in contrast to



past accountability systems which involved a single numeric assessment point. The 5 color coding system running from blue, green, yellow, orange and red is a graphic representation of where a school or district's students are performing in their progress toward meeting the expectations outlined by the 8 state priorities defined by the Local

Control Funding Formula (LCFF), including student achievement on meeting academic standards, suspension rates, school climate, and more. Blue represents the highest performance category, green is the target, yellow and orange represent the need for improvement and red represents a more intensive need for review and improvement. This system presents information in a manner that supports the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) process which informs instructional practices throughout the District. Not all of the indicators are being reported at this time; the CA School Dashboard is currently in "beta" release, and will be fully operational in the fall of 2017.

The Academic Indicators are currently using the 2016 CAASPP data that was reported to parents and schools last year. Overall, the San Mateo–Foster City School District is pleased with the 2016 CAASPP results and finds this new format helpful. The District met the performance target in the area of English Language Arts and Math for all students. The District was also in the "green" for suspension rates. As expected, there are always areas in need of improvement and the SMFCSD will continue the work that was started this school year related to the academic progress of our English Learners. Another area of need, for our District and districts across the state of California, is in academic progress of students with disabilities.

Formative and summative assessments along with teacher observation, inform our work with students and is captured in our LCAP process. During the 2016-2017 school year, particular instructional goals were:

- Implementing instructional strategies for improved early literacy skills and transitioning to a new reading assessment
- Promoting academic language for all students and particularly for English Learners
- Rolling out new Mathematics materials at the elementary level
- Selecting new English Language Arts and English Language Development materials which will roll out in the fall of 2017

• Professional development for all educational staff

Moving forward, the District will continue to review our data and meet with staff, parents and community members to engage all of us in the improvement process and capture that information in our LCAP.

Measures A and Y

As a reminder, Measure A expires June 2017. This Measure provides \$7 million annually to the District for a variety of educational programs. In order to protect and maintain these programs, the San Mateo–Foster City School District Board of Trustees placed Measure Y on the **March 28th** mail-in ballot. Teachers enthusiastically recommend **Benchmark Advance** for Board approval as SMFCSD's new English Language Arts/English Language Development (ELA/ELD) curriculum for K-5 students. Fiesta Gardens International School Pilot Teachers also recommend **Benchmark Adelante Biliteracy Program** for their new ELA/ELD curriculum.



Following a pilot process of examining and teaching two State approved ELD/ELA

programs, the Pilot Committee came to consensus on February 23, 2017. Each pilot teacher advocated for the ELA/ELD program they thought would best meet the needs of all San Mateo-Foster City elementary students, the outcome was clear– *Benchmark Advance*. The Transitional Kindergarten (TK) teachers are continuing their pilot a bit longer since the *Benchmark* materials were only recently released. At the conclusion of the process, the Pilot Committee is excited to recommend *Benchmark Advance* for Board approval as SMFCSD's new ELA/ELD curriculum.

The *Benchmark Advance* ELA/ELD materials will be on display for public review through **Thursday, April 20th** in the Instructional Materials Center at the SMFCSD District Office. The IMC is open Monday through Thursday from 12:30-4:30pm.


San Mateo County Office of Education Parent Institute
