

WV PTO SPRING CARNIVAL UPDATE

After such a difficult 2 years, it was so amazing to be able to bring back the annual PTO carnival. To see everyone together, our children and families having such fun, and the fantastic sense of community that was brought this year was astounding! Here are some take-aways:

- Volunteers: Thank you so much to all the volunteers; we had 133 volunteer spots that were filled! We could NOT have done this event without all your help!
- **Donations:** Thank you to all the parents who donated for the Bottle Blast. Over a thousand drinks were donated and what we have left will be used for students at the Bulldog Fun Run!

Outdoor Learning Update

Last spring we raised over \$11K for an outdoor learning project! The funds are being used to (1) add STEM and seating features to the Science Court and (2) install an outdoor learning classroom and native plant area on the north side of the school.

Science Court: We are almost all done with our science court updates! Art teacher Kayley Isaacson (Ms. Bird) has been hard at work painting some amazing STEM murals in the courtyard. We've also added outdoor cushions, a picnic blanket and chairs for seating options so the courtyard can be used for individual reading. Ms. Nord helped refresh our plants, and we will be adding a weather station and fairy tree before the end of the school year. Ask your student if they've seen the updates!

Outdoor classroom: We are working with Landbridge Ecological to install a nature-based outdoor classroom, native plants and stepping stones. The outdoor classroom installation will begin next month and will be ready for use in the fall! The native plants will be installed later this summer. We will need some volunteers to help with planting, so please reach out to westviewmnpto@gmail.com if you can help!
