- Opened the <u>free</u> NEF Resource Store and Library in October 2021
- Surveyed NISD teachers in fall 2021 and spring 2022 for program feedback
- Expanded times for Resource Store and Library in-person shopping, including one Saturday per month
 - Updated website resources to make it easier to access NEF support systems

- In partnership with NEF Board Member Adam Hess and Cox Elementary P.E. Teacher Stacie Breckley



Monthly Food Pantry

- NEF Resource Store and Library
 - Every NISD campus utilized the resource
 - 658 online orders fulfilled
 - 200 in-person shoppers
 - 1,539 books distributed
- Snack Packs
 - More than 2,000 packed for summer school students
- TAFB and NEF mobile food pantry
 - Served 1,492 households and 7,484 individuals since May 2021
 - More than 1,000 volunteer hours


Strategic Sponsorships

 - NRSEA Rookie of the Year award




Educator Survey... the results are in!

- How many NISD students benefited from the resources you received? 15,169




How satisfied are you with the materials/books you received?




NEF Resource Store saves the day!
