San Mateo-Foster City School District, August 2021

Recap of the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA)

- Modeled after the Federal Voting Rights Act (passed in 1965)
 - Intended to ensure that local jurisdictions do not utilize voting systems that deprive minority voters of their political power
- California enacted its version (the CVRA) much later 2001
- The CVRA prohibits the use of any election system "that impairs the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice or its ability to influence the outcome of an election." Jurisdictions can be sued if they elect their governing body using an at-large, from-districts, or mixed election system. If the court finds against a jurisdiction, the jurisdiction must change its election system and pay the plaintiff's attorneys, experts, and other expenses.

How will this transition affect voters?

■ If approved, registered voters in the school district boundaries will have the opportunity to vote for a candidate for a School Board candidate who lives in their By-Trustee Area. Registered voters will not be able to vote for School Board candidates from By-Trustee Areas in which they do not reside.

	Initial Public Hearings June 22 & 29, 2021	Initial two public hearings prior to drafting maps within 30 days of each other. Education and input solicitation from District's communities.
	Draft maps July 29, 2021	Release draft maps.
	Hearings on draft maps August 6, 16 & 26, 2021	At least two meetings within 45 days of each other to discuss and revise maps and discuss the election sequence.
	Map adoption August 26, 2021	Final maps must be posted for 7 days prior to any hearing adopting one. Period in which plaintiff is barred from filing lawsuit expires on September 8, 2021.
	County Committee Hearing Early September 2021	County Committee on School District Organization holds a public hearing within District boundaries to consider and approve Board-selected map.
	Prior to March 1, 2022	Trustee area boundaries revised to reflect 2020 Census data. Official 2020 Census data was not available in time to give District sufficient time to complete the transition process within the 90-day time period safe harbor period.
	November 2022	First by-trustee area elections held in three trustee areas.

A hearing "at which the public is invited to provide input regarding the content of the draft map or maps and the proposed sequence of elections, if applicable."

What criteria will be used to select the final map?


- The Board will consider a range of factors in selecting the final map including (but not limited to):
 - Equal population
 - Communities of interest
 - Compactness
 - Visible boundaries (man-made and natural geographic features)
 - Respect for voters' wishes
 - Other local considerations (i.e., school boundaries, locations of school sites)

What is a community of interest?


- A community of interest is any distinctive area within the school district boundaries that has a definable group of people, unique geography or some other distinguishable feature or characteristic that it would be undesirable to divide in the creation of By-Trustee Areas. Some of these may already be clearly established and others may be defined as a result of this process. This distinction requires strong community input to ensure communities of interest are protected in this process.
 - School attendance areas
 - Natural neighborhood dividing lines
 - Areas around parks or other landmarks
 - Common issues, activities, or concerns
 - Shared demographic characteristics (socio-economic status, education level, linguistic isolation)

Will all 5 Governing Board member seats be open for election at the District's next general election (2022)?


■ No. In 2022, the District will have two Governing Board seats up for election during its first by-trustee area election.




