Superintendent's Note

We successfully completed what was undoubtedly the most difficult school year in my 30+ years of teaching. The challenges of virtual learning for an extended time were immense, and our school community rallied to support our students and one another.

Recognizing the layered stress that the pandemic put upon our community, we focused on maintaining learning in the most respectful and healthy way possible. The norm for educating students and collaborating with one another became Zoom, parking lot wifi, drive up food service, and virtual learning experiences. Our Thought Exchange survey to parents provided many positive comments about the plans, communication, and the great work of our staff. I am exceptionally proud of how our community came together and I am confident that we are much stronger for what we have gone through.

While the end of this year has been one for the record books, we expect next year to break that record. We can only guess at what the 2020-2021 school year will look like, but I can say we will be exceptionally prepared to support all of our students and continue their learning when we get back in session.

To prepare for what lies ahead of us, in early May we began providing all teachers new professional development on virtual learning as we explored best practices for delivering instruction digitally. Also, teachers started working last week on developing instructional units to be delivered virtually at the start of the year should we have to go that direction.

As I write this article in mid-June (when this newsletter is produced), we don't know yet when we will be back in session but we do know that there will be students and families who will find it difficult to attend in person. Whether medically fragile, or living with others who are medically fragile, we know that many of our students will need to continue learning regardless of how much time they can spend in our buildings. That is why our teachers are preparing to flip their instructional plans to provide introductory lessons virtually (if needed) and then support students if/when they are able to attend class in person. We will not let any student fall through the cracks.

While many virtual schools see the student teacher ratio exceeding 100, we will maintain our average class balance so that all students can be supported by a teacher regardless of their ability to walk through our doors each day. All of our students, whether live, virtual, or blended will be taught at high levels by Mt. Vernon teachers using Mt. Vernon curriculum.

We are currently working with a task force of 25 people representing all factions of our work...including a high school student, to develop plans for how we will successfully chart the previously unexplored terrain of our new normal in education. From what I know and have experienced these last three months, I am confident that Mt. Vernon is up for the challenge to thrive during these trying times.

If you know a teacher, administrator, counselor, cook, custodian, maintenance personnel, bus driver, technology staff person, school nurse, teacher assistant, secretary, or coach, please thank them for going above and beyond and continue to support them during our next phase of this worldwide pandemic.

MVHS Named Best High School by U.S. News & World Report

The U.S. News and World Report has ranked Mt. Vernon High School (MVHS) in the top tier of the national high school rankings, specifically #17 in the central region and #64 in Indiana. Schools are ranked based on their performance on state-required tests, graduation rates, and how well the schools' students are prepared for college. The U.S. News ranked approximately 17,790 public high schools in the nation.

Mt. Vernon High School Principal, Mr. Casey Dodd, shared, "We are extremely proud to receive this accolade as it represents all the hard work and dedication that our students and staff put in to ensure our graduates are ready for their next step after finishing their time at MVHS."

MVHS Students ranked high on the college readiness index with a 31.1. The college readiness index rank is based on the proportions of seniors who took and passed at least one AP exam. The index factored a 63% passing rate out of the 43% of seniors who took an AP exam. This placed MVHS in the 80th percentile, nationally.

The MVHS data that was used indicated that the MVHS student body makeup was 50% male and 50% female. The total enrollment was 1,283 with 19% minority enrollment and 22% economically disadvantaged. There were 65 full-time teachers

at Mt. Vernon High School during the 2017-2018 school year.

The methodology in ranking the collected data from the nation's state departments of education, and used public high schools that had 12th grade enrollment of 15 or greater, or sufficient enrollment in other high school grades during the 2017-2018 school year. The Common Core of Data, College Board (particularly for the AP test data), International Baccalaureate data, and the statewide accountability proficiency test results were used as measurements for school data.

A four-step process determined the Best High Schools. The first three steps ensure that the schools serve all of their students well. If schools made it past the first three steps, a fourth step assessed the degree schools prepare students for college-level work.

Mt. Vernon Community School Corporation is proud to share the success of Mt. Vernon High School's students, staff and leadership. Mt. Vernon High School has also been named a four-star school for the last four years in a row.

Chromebooks from 2019-2020

Pick-up Locker/Desk Belongings FROM 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR

Families can retrieve their child's personal belongings and drop off any library books from the 2019-2020 school year in the methods outlined below. Mini Marauder Preschool: The Mini Marauder Preschool will be open on July 15 from 10-11 a.m., 2-3 p.m. and 5-6 p.m. The student's belongings will be in a labeled bag by their teacher's name and distributed to the cars in the preschool parking lot. Families are asked to not get out of their vehicles.

Elementary Schools: Families are asked to stay in their vehicles and follow the traffic flow maps distributed by their respective schools. Families with multiple students may choose one date. Families may send a designee; the designee must provide the student's name, grade and teacher.

REGISTRATION

Centralized Registration: Information will be sent via email to parents/guardians in July for a virtual Centralized Registration. Plans are being made on how to distribute class schedules/homeroom assignments, fee statements, paying student fees, and more.

Returning Students Registration: All MV parents/guardians need to register returning students through their Skyward account after Monday, July 13 at 9 a.m. It is important that registration be completed PRIOR to the first day of school.

Online Kindergarten Registration: It is imperative to have all Kindergarten students register so MV may prepare to provide enough teachers to keep the class size low. MVCSC will have full-day kindergarten only. On or before August 1, 2020, students must be five years old to attend kindergarten. Please visit mvsc.k12.in.us/news/kdg for details.

SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION

On the first day of school, students should be ready for the bus at least one hour before school starts. Approximate pick-up times will be set within a few days of the start of school and will be posted on the MVCSC Transportation Department's web page at that time.

UP-TO-DATE IMMUNIZATIONS

Indiana law requires each child enrolled in school to be completely immunized against communicable diseases. All records must be on file before the child can attend classes. Please refer to the Health Services website page for immunization details.

PAYING STUDENT FEES

Student fees are due at the beginning of the school year after they are posted in your Skyward account. They can be paid through SchoolPay (linked under "Parents" on mvsc.k12.in.us). Payments can easily be made via Visa, Mastercard, or Discover credit cards.

MEAL ASSISTANCE: After July 15, 2020, any family wishing to apply for meal assistance may do so by logging into Skyward Family Access, opening the Food Service tab, and clicking on Applications. Students eligible for free or reduced lunch assistance may also qualify for textbook rental/student fee assistance. Watch for the "Textbook Rental Assistance" option in the online application.

ONLINE MEAL PAYMENT: Parents/guardians may easily deposit funds into their child's account online through SchoolPay via Visa, Mastercard, or Discover credit cards. Parents/guardians may transfer money into your child's account, load funds, and set alerts using this system. We also accept cash and checks. If writing checks, we ask you to write your child's name on the memo line.

2020-2021 CHROMEBOOK PROTECTION

Parents/guardians will have the opportunity to purchase a protection plan for each child's Chromebook. The device is protected after payment is received.

- We will host after-school study tables for middle and high school students participating in athletics or other regular after-school activities. No other students will be allowed to stay in the school buildings.
- Buses will run their regular routes departing 45 minutes earlier on Early Release Wednesdays.
