- Activity 13, middle school technology refresh, currently has a negative balance due to the amount of the encumbrance within Munis. However, BCSD will be receiving \$2.4 million in reimbursement for most of this expense through the district application for Emergency Connectivity Funds (ECF). These funds are being provided by the FCC to districts that applied for the funds. They are intended to be used to provide the tools and services needed for remote learning during the COVID-19 emergency period. A budget adjustment will be made when invoice is actually paid. The projected savings on this activity will be used to fund an elementary refresh in the coming year which will also be a saving to the 8% project list.
