CALVERT COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS 2025 High School Summer

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Calvert County Public Schools (CCPS) offers high school courses during the summer delivered online or in a traditional setting.

HIGH SCHOOL ONLINE COURSES (original and review credit):

CCPS offers online Financial Literacy, Foundations of Technology, Foundations of Computer Science, Health I, Health II, Music Appreciation, Spanish I, and Spanish II. Students must attend a synchronous orientation meeting using Microsoft Teams on the first day of the course. Some courses may require students to meet with the instructor up to three additional times during the summer term. Students who request to take an online course must complete the Online Learning Interest Survey. Students who would like to register for an online summer course must complete the Summer School Online Course Registration Form. This form will become available on May 5 at 8:00 a.m. and will close on June 13, 2025. Enrollment priority is based on a student's 2025-2026 grade level.

Online courses may be taken for original or review credit. Online courses will begin on June 23 and will end on July 31, 2025. These courses require synchronous Teams meetings on the dates below. Tentative dates are listed but are subject to change. The course instructor will communicate the required virtual meetings.

- Music Appreciation (Rising seniors only) [must attend first orientation meeting] 6/23+
- Spanish I (must attend first orientation meeting) 6/23+
- Spanish II (must attend first orientation meeting) 6/23+

TRADITIONAL REVIEW COURSES

Courses are offered to students who did not successfully complete a course in which they were enrolled during the regular school year. In-person summer school will be 16 days long, and the program will require attendance for the full duration. Students may miss no more than two days of summer school without losing credit. Students may take a maximum of two inperson summer school courses. Students who would like to register for a summer school review course must complete the HS Summer School Review Credit Course Registration Form. This form will become available on May 12, 2025 at 8:00 a.m. and will close on June 25, 2025

SUMMER SCHOOL COURSES

The CCPS high school summer school program for traditional review courses will be held at Calvert High School from July 7 to July 31, 2025. These courses will be held Monday – Thursday for 3 hours and 45 minutes per course. Morning and afternoon sessions will be offered if there is sufficient enrollment. The sessions will be held from 7:30 am to 11:15 am or 11:45 am to 3:30 pm.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Online Course Registration

Students must complete the <u>Summer School Online Course Registration Form</u> to begin the registration process. **This form will become available on May 5 at 8:00 a.m. and will close on June 13, 2025.** Registration priority is based on a student's 2025-2026 grade level.

Completion of the online form **does not guarantee** a student a spot in a course. Online courses run based on student interest. **Enrollment in online summer courses is limited and priority will be given to rising seniors and juniors.**

After enrollments have been finalized, students and guardians will be contacted via email to confirm if they have been officially enrolled, waitlisted, or if there is no spot available in a course.

Traditional Review Course Registration

Registration for traditional review courses begins on May 12, 2025. Students should complete registration at the following link on or after May 12, 2025: HS Summer School Review Credit Course Registration Form. Students should confirm the summer school courses they need to take with their school counselor prior to the submission of the Summer School Registration Form. Students not enrolled in a CCPS high school may submit their payment at the summer school office at Career & Technology Academy 330 Dorsey Rd. Prince Frederick, MD 20678. Final class schedules for traditional review courses are determined from the registration data available on June 25, 2025. Time limitations preclude the mailing of class acceptance notices to students. Registration information will be emailed to students on July 2, 2025 and schedules will be available by phone or in person at the summer school office on July 2.

TUITION

There is no charge for CCPS students to enroll in a review course for Summer 2025. Students enrolling in an online course for original credit will be charged \$225.00 for a half-credit course and \$325.00 for a full-credit course (this includes a \$25.00 non-refundable application fee). Courses for original credit are limited, and priority of enrollment will be given to rising seniors and juniors.

Private School/Non-County Resident* tuition for Online Courses: \$275.00 half-credit/\$375.00 full-credit

*A non-resident is a person who is permanently located outside Calvert County during the regular academic year.

Payment instructions will be sent to families if their student is officially enrolled in an online course. Full tuition payments must be submitted by June 13, 2025. Checks are to be made payable to Calvert County Public Schools. An online payment option is available for credit card payments. If a student withdraws from a course after attending one or more classes, no tuition will be refunded. However, if a course is canceled, the full tuition will be refunded.

TRANSPORTATION

Calvert County Public Schools <u>does not</u> provide transportation during the summer term.
