What is a strategic plan?

A strategic plan is the result of a process by which an organization develops a mission, vision and the long-term goals and strategies that align with these. It is a written road map to the future. It documents your steps toward success, displays who you are, outlines where you want to go and how you intend to get there over a long-term. Developing a plan involves an in-depth look into where your organization has come from, where it wants to go and what it will take to get there. A strategic plan helps to answer the "what", "when", "why" and "how" of the organizations actions for the next several years.

How was the Strategic Plan developed?

A Strategic Plan Steering Committee was formed in September 2004. During the 2004-2005 school year, the Steering Committee prepared an initial draft of the plan which was reviewed by the Board of Education.
Goals and objectives that were created in the summer of
2005 provide a benchmark to evaluate the District's
progress. Parents, teachers, and administrators
volunteered their time to serve on Action Plan Teams to
create precise plans for implementation which began in
September 2006. The plans were presented to the
Board of Education in June 2006 for review and final
approval for the Strategic Plan was granted on August
15, 2006.

What will the Strategic Plan do for the District?

The strategic plan establishes goals and defines objectives to accomplish the following:

 Well thought-out goals will serve as a focal point for programs and policies, ensuring the necessary resources to realize those goals and objectives. It

- ensures the most effective use of the resources by focusing them on key priorities.
- Goals and objectives will provide a benchmark to evaluate the District's progress in meeting the intent of the Mission Statement. It provides a base from which progress can be measured.
- Goals can only be achieved through mutual cooperation. The nature, clarity and the importance of the goals will have an impact on how people work together.
- Goals will provide insight to employees, parents, students and the community regarding the direction and philosophy of the District.
- Goals provide a boundary for the decision-making practices of the District. The strategic plan provides a tool for the decision makers to measure the goals of the District in comparison to the decisions being made.


