

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

The St. Ann “APP”: Associate Pastor’s Perspective - The son of Czech immigrants who settled in Kansas, Father Emil Kapaun (born in 1916) worked on his family’s farm growing up. Having entered the seminary after graduating from Pilsen Public High School, he was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Wichita in 1940 and was an associate pastor for a few years before enlisting as a chaplain in the U.S. Army.

Sent to serve a number of posts in his early days as chaplain, Father Kapaun eventually was stationed on the front lines in the Korean War. In late 1950, he was captured by the Chinese military after refusing to leave wounded American soldiers and subsequently sent to a prison camp where he sang songs to boost morale among the POWs, offered them his food portions, and held starving and delirious soldiers in his arms until they died.

A year later, Kapaun was suffering from dysentery, pneumonia and a blood clot. He was isolated and left alone to die, which he did a month later at the age of 34.

The Diocese of Wichita opened Father’s cause for canonization in 2015, and he has recently been named a ‘Servant of God.’

Father Kapaun is one of countless men and women who have given their lives in service to our country since its founding. As we celebrate Memorial Day this weekend, reflect on these words that were recently published in the *Catholic Sun*, the newspaper of the Diocese of Syracuse, and written by Rev. Curtiss Dwyer:

“Memorial Day is an opportunity, as a nation, to remember and appreciate those who have died so that we might live … freely. The civil blessings of stability, prosperity and freedom we enjoy are a testament to the price they paid. As Catholics, we remember those who have gone before and pray for their souls. Honoring the fallen [especially by offering Masses for the repose of their souls] is important for us … who tend to take our blessings for granted.

Most important of all, Memorial Day can help inspire us to the greatest thing of which we are capable, by God’s grace: sacrificial love. Love that sacrifices for the beloved is divine and the only true love. In remembering what Our Lord did, what all His saints have done in memory of Him, we are reoriented to what life is really all about. We are more likely, in our turn, to love someone at our expense. At its best, Memorial Day is a civil and military echo of a profound theological truth: that God, “who is love” sacrificed Himself so that we might live.

And Our Lord says to each of us: “Do this in memory of Me.”

Today as we celebrate the feast of the Ascension we are reminded that Christ’s saving work on earth continues through his disciples...and now through us. **When we give to the poor, God indeed pours his love, peace and joy into our hearts, into our lives and into the hearts of those who are poor.**




