
Have a wonderful half term break everyone. As I always say, please make sure your children (and you!) get some rest and recharge the batteries before the fun-filled run in to the end of term.

On Friday, we took 48 pupils in Years 4-6 to the Resorts World Arena in Birmingham, where they performed alongside 5,500 other pupils from around the country. The day started with pupils receiving their Young Voices hoodies before getting on the coach. When we arrived, we went straight to Pizza Express where everyone enjoyed some delicious food. Shortly after, we made our way to the arena which has a capacity of almost 16,000. Pupils were blown away by the enormity of the arena and excitement was bubbling for the event. Rehearsals then took place, and the sound that 5,500 pupils can make when singing in unison was incredible. Songs chosen for the event were 'O Fortuna, Lion King Medley, Sing from Your Heart, Mambo Italiano, Lovely Day, The Living Years, Beatles Medley, Muppets Medley, Power in Me and Pop Medley', with some acts from the World Beatbox Champions, Yolanda Brown and Andrew Roachford as well as Young Voices regulars Urban Strides. Alongside learning all the songs, pupils (and staff) had to master some dance moves, much to everyone's amusement. After a brief tea break the concert started, with the Resorts World Arena at full capacity, the atmosphere was electric and pupils were buzzing. Songs were sung with great gusto and the parents even had an opportunity to have a go at beatboxing. The concert was an amazing experience and after the event, all pupils and parents were keen to attend next year!

On Saturday 23 May, members of the Year 6 Greenpower Kit Car club took part in the Race Day at Renishaw in Dursley. The club started in September and the group have been slowly constructing the electric car under the guidance of Mr Kemp. Once constructed, initial testing began in the cold evenings of February and progress was made with the bodywork design. The car name 'The Joker' was born and bodywork created using the schools CAD CAM equipment. Towards the end of the spring term and early in the summer, race practice was possible with the children working on control, maintenance and management of their car in preparation for slalom, drag and lap racing.

We had an early start on Saturday leaving school at 7am, but arriving in plenty of time to check the car and get it in prime condition, ready for racing. There were some quick cars on show in the morning time trial events, but our drivers showed great control, failing to knock any cones over and performing well, especially in the slalom event.

The afternoon was dedicated to the main event of lap racing and we were drawn in the last heat of the day which we managed to win to progress to the semi-finals. We had some luck in the semi-final as one car withdrew due to damage and on the first corner of the race, the other competitor clipped the curb and rolled their car, allowing us to progress to the final by default. The out and out winner won the final comfortably, but our driver battled hard, gaining a respectable third place finish from a field of 18. Sadly, I was very little in 1977 for the Queen's Silver Jubilee, however I do remember the diamond jubilee creating a large mosaic with my local community and attending a street party on the village green! What do you remember? As we run up to half term and the Platinum Jubilee weekend, let's reflect on the significance of this 70-year milestone.

1 monarch has reigned for 70 years, the longest reigning UK monarch

3rd in line to throne when she was born on April 21st, 1926; only three UK monarchs have celebrated a Golden Jubilee (the others were King George III, Queen Victoria)

14 Prime Ministers, Winston Churchill the first and Tony Blair the first PM who was born within Queen Elizabeth's reign

73 years married to Prince Philip

BEARDED DRAGON



What parents need to know about cross-platform sharing of inappropriate content

Anyone can post anything online. It's simultaneously one of the internet's most joyous qualities and one of its greatest perils. For every upload that's heart-warming, helpful or just plain hilarious, you'll find, unfortunately, an equal amount of content that is shocking, frightening or upsetting... particularly to young eyes and ears.

Some of this material is placed deliberately, out of unfathomable malice. More commonly, though, it was created for mature viewers and ended up on a young person's device by accident or oversight: seeping into child-friendly areas from more adult-oriented corners of the web. <u>This guide</u> analyses the possible risks of cross-platform sharing.



WORMERIES


