

St. Anne Catholic School began its long standing tradition of providing academic excellence and forming young disciples of Christ in 1951 in Rock Hill, South Carolina. Today St. Anne serves over 320 students from K3 through grade 12 on two campuses. The Lower School Campus is part of the St. Anne parish located in Rock Hill and serves students age 3 through 8th grade. The high school is currently located on the St. Philip Neri parish campus located in Fort Mill, just a short drive from the lower school.

St. Anne has a rich history. After the 1954 Supreme Court decision Brown vs. Board of Education ruled that segregated public schools were unconstitutional, St. Anne's School opened its doors to all Catholic children in the parish, regardless of race, and in doing so became the first racially integrated school in South Carolina. From its very humble beginnings with a handful of pupils in the rectory on Saluda Street in Rock Hill to its present enrollment of 320 students on two campuses, St. Anne School continues to reflect the faith, service, and diversity of the Catholic community in Rock Hill.
