Principal's Corner

President Obama and the Department of Education have recently made a recommendation to review the amount of summative tests students are required to take during the course of the school year. Since the passage of No Child Left Behind legislation, high-stakes tests have been discussed for both their benefits and their drawbacks. It is a valuable conversation.

At Sacajawea, we have district assessments in each content area typically given to students semi-annually or at the end of the year. These assessments are based on the standards—district and state—for each subject and provide information for our students as a measure of their continued growth. Equally of value is the information to our staff about our curriculum, programs and quality of instruction.

We use STAR assessments three times a year for measuring student learning in math and reading. The data from these tests are used to indicate student growth through the course of the year. We want all of our students to reach proficiency, but we are also committed for each one—regardless of where he/she starts—to continue to grow.

A final note—we do not teach to the tests; we teach to the standards. The assessments measure growth toward the standards, which are those skills and concepts that will lay the foundation both for future success in school as well as in life.

According to *MT Code Annotated 20-5-106 (4)(a)*, "If the child is discovered by the attendance officer to be *truant on 9 or more days or 54 or more parts of a day in 1 school year, the child may be referred to youth court as habitually truant under Title 41, chapter 5."* Any student deemed habitually truant may also be considered a "youth in need of intervention" as defined by 41-5-103(51)(ii), MCA.
