## **Principal's Corner**

On September 28<sup>th</sup>, the staff of Sacajawea met for our staff development PIR day. These days are scheduled approximately every six weeks throughout the course of the year to allow our teachers to enhance their instructional skills, collaborate with their colleagues and further work in their classrooms.

As a staff, we are focusing on three collective targets—developing the students' critical reading and communication skills, personalizing our instruction and support of each student, and learning from each other. On the 28<sup>th</sup> we analyzed strategies we can use to ensure each of our students are able to access information through their reading in every subject area. Our intention is to develop the literacy skills of our students in each discipline—to read as historians, as scientists, as mathematicians—with purpose and success.

Good readers read. Readers become better readers. Seems simple, but we also know that kids develop their reading abilities by reading frequently and for both purpose and pleasure. To that end, we have also begun Falcon RED—Read Every Day. Each Tuesday, we are dedicating 30 minutes for the entire school—students and staff—to read. It's been great! Ask your kids about their books and encourage them to read each day at home as well. Heck, grab a book and join them.

On *November 3*, Bozeman Elementary voters will decide on bond issues to *renovate and expand Hawthorne Elementary and Sacajawea Middle School*. (It is a mail ballot election, ballots will be mailed on Oct 19.)

The proposed improvements to SMS include additional classroom space, larger common areas, and expanded health enhancement and music rooms. Building code, safety, and energy updates will also be made to existing interior spaces.

The proposed improvements to Hawthorne include replacing the existing temporary classrooms with a permanent addition, moving the lunch room out of the basement, relocating the school's main entrance to improve school security, and providing an elevator for second floor accessibility.
