Principal's Message

With the snow, rain, occasional sun and mud all around us, it's clearly spring in Montana. And with the season is the recognition that our school year is also nearing an end. It always seems to have passed quickly when one reaches this point in the year, but we are looking forward to a very strong close.

This past fall, our school set out with three major areas of focus: to clearly identify the prioritized skills and concepts for each content area; to learn with and from each other as a staff to better support the learning of our students; and to manage the changes and disruption caused by the construction project. We have had success in all three areas.

At each professional development day (with the exception of April) as well as on a bi-monthly basis, our teachers have reviewed the current state and district standards, determined which of those were most essential for every student to learn at each grade level, and then began the systematic process of clearly communicating these goals to our students. The intention is to ensure that every student, regardless of the teacher or class, will be guided to mastery of the most significant skills and concepts each one needs to progress successfully.

This process has led to focused collaboration among our staff. We have had a strong commitment to understanding each student on a personal level and providing the appropriate support and challenge for each. This is frequently done in team and parent meetings, but this year we have also worked closely in the various disciplines to better align our work.

Finally, in case you have not noticed, we have been dealing with a bit of construction. A project of this size, literally right alongside a classroom--think steel being cut on the other side of the wall while we are discussing John Steinbeck--could have been overwhelming. However, with the amazing patience, persistence, and flexibility of our staff, we have maintained our focus on instruction and learning throughout the year. We also could not have done it without the awareness and responsiveness of the construction team--Martel and the other contractors have been terrific to work with! We are all very excited for the full completion by mid-August and the start of next year.

It's been a busy, yet fruitful, school year. Thank you all for sharing your sons and daughters and for partnering with us throughout the year.
