This week brings a close to the second trimester, and we look forward to maintaining our progress through the final one-third of the year.

As you have certainly noticed, we have also made considerable progress with the construction project. Our science classes are all enjoying the newly completed rooms and our seventh graders have expanded into their increased commons area. The additional classrooms in the sixth and eighth grade wings are reaching final stages as well as the commons areas.

On the west side, the exterior walls, roofing and foundational flooring have been completed allowing for the infrastructure to be added. New spaces for our arts and technology classes will be created alongside flex spaces for additional elective options in the coming years. The new fitness and music areas are also being enclosed allowing for the interior construction needed to expand to meet the needs of our health and music programs. This spring and summer internal renovation will provide additional and more efficient space for the library, counseling, administration, special education, and support programs.
