Happy spring! We've entered our third trimester and are looking forward to the warmer weather and finishing the year strongly!

All students are scheduled to take the Smarter Balanced literacy and math tests in the coming weeks. These assessments will measure the students' growth in their reading, writing and math skills based on the Montana State Standards in those areas. They use a rigorous test platform that will allow students to apply their skills in real-life scenarios. Note we have rescheduled the testing dates for our students: 7th grade--April 16-20, 8th grade--April 23-27, and 6th grade--April 30-May 4. Please encourage your students to demonstrate their best abilities.

Information will be sent to you shortly about our Spring Conferences to be held on Thursday, April 12. Each team will be scheduling specific times to meet with students and families as well as providing time for drop-in visits. In the next few days before conferences, students will be reflecting on their learning this year as well as looking forward to their anticipated growth in the spring and coming years. If you visit during the drop-in times, you can expect to chat informally with your student's teachers, have your son/daughter share evidence of learning, and visit elective classrooms.

Also on April 12, we will be providing an informational meeting for parents to discuss the transition to standards-based grading which will be fully implemented at the middle schools next year. This move from the traditional to standards-based reporting will provide more accurate reporting of student learning as well as the behavior attributes necessary for on-going success. Please plan to join us at 6:00 on Thursday, April 12, in the cafeteria to learn more about the standards-based system.

His presentations aim to give everyone a better understanding of mental illness, addiction, and suicide.

Thriving Families

Struggling to get your middle school student to talk? Wish they would open up more? Family schedules are busy and hectic. Even brief moments talking can deepen our relationship with our child. Here are a few tips to foster conversation with your child:

1. Talk when you are side by side.

Opportunities for short check-ins can be found in many places, such as driving in the car, playing basketball, walking the dog together, or chatting at bedtime. Face to face conversations can be intense for tweens and teens. Side by side conversations, although brief, can be powerful and filled with insight.

2. Use open-ended questions.

Open-ended questions deepen dialogue with our kids. They encourage elaboration and discussion. Closed-questions are answered with a yes or no and limit communication between the parent and child. Examples of open-ended questions include: What was it like for you? How would you like that to be different? What worries you about that? What are your thoughts about that? What might you do next?

Youth Risk Behavior Survey Update

What is the Youth Risk Behavior Survey?

The Youth Risk Behavior (YRBS) assists educators and health professionals in determining the prevalance of health-risk behaviors as self-reported by Montana youth. The Bozeman School District Foundations/Safety committee comprised of District staff, teachers, principals, and parents reviewed the YRBS data in January 2017. The committee set actionable goals around facilitating positive student behavior based on trends observed in the YRBS data. The goals include increasing the proportion of students getting at least 8 hours of sleep on week nights by 3-5% each survey year, decreasing tobacco, alcohol and marijuana use by 5% each survey year, and increasing fitness by 3% annually. Bozeman School District recognized the importance of sharing this information with care providers and the community.
