Principal's Message

When students arrive at middle school from elementary, we often hear that parents are not sure how to stay involved in their kids' learning. Many parents are very comfortable volunteering in their student's previous school. They become very familiar with the one or two teachers in the younger grades, and now see five or more teachers' names on their kids' schedules. However, your young adolescents need your involvement now as much as ever.

With all of the changes your kids encounter during these middle years, your support and interest are invaluable. One of the easiest ways is to have your student share their learning. Avoid asking the old stand-by, "How was school today?" It is too easy for your kids to give the one word response. Ask open-ended questions that encourage an explanation of their learning (e.g. "Tell me an interesting activity you did in science today." "What do you enjoy about the book you're reading?").

Check the different resources available for what your child is learning. Many of the teachers and teams have websites, some send out daily or weekly e-mails, and all expect the students to record their homework in some manner. Determine which way works best for your student and ask him/her regularly about their learning. Organizing and scheduling tasks is a life-skill; help your student identify and refine the best strategy for them.

Establish regular homework times and locations for your student away from technology (unless it's being used in their learning). When an assignment or activity is completed, take a moment to have your son/daughter explain the learning. If no homework is assigned, have your student read for 30 minutes. Even better, join them with your book or magazine. Homework will not be assigned every night, but reading or practicing an instrument can be part of a daily routine.

We recognize that your student will be most successful when we effectively partner with you in their learning. Thanks for your work with us.
