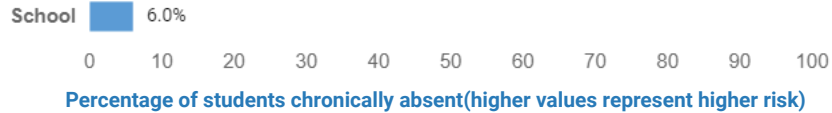

School Highlights Reported by the District:

- Sayreville Middle School includes grades 6 - 8 with an enrollment of 1384 students. The school was recognized by Special Olympics as a Unified Champion School.
- Sayreville Middle School's Character Education Pennant Program/Medal of Honor Program recognizes students for positive behaviors, school involvement and academic achievement.
- Sayreville Middle School is planning to implement a Unified Elective Program in 21-22 where special education students will work alongside regular education students in elective courses.
