Pick Up & Drop Off

☆ To park in the afternoon...slowly advance on the left of the line of vehicles and enter via the west driveway. Park in a designated space before

Spotlight on Fourth Grade

Last Tuesday, we had a fabulous presentation from Dr. Lloyd & his robot Looney, from the MSU Computer Science depart. In addition to his presentation about computing & robots, the MSU CS department also has a set of "Looney Challenges." Our 4th graders are currently learning how to read/understand complex texts through the lens of historical fiction. All students are learning about historical events by participating in one of several books groups incl. the Revolutionary War, Civil War, Westward Expansion, WWII & Civil Rights. The Trout in the Classroom project in Mr. Mollgaard's class has provided opportunities for integrated art through trout watercolor along with other learning experiences that will culminate in a field trip to release the trout in June. Ms. Burgard's class has been participating in the Chromebook pilot with collaborative writing & research experiences, & all 4th-graders are working frequently & fluidly with Googledocs. You should see what great problem solvers they are - many surpassing their teachers in tackling new challenges on the computer!



Take a look at the graphic to the right or the brief overview in the article below that describes the three areas every student needs to master in order to succeed in a world that is constantly changing: learn, create and collaborate. As our classrooms make this shift you will continue to see fewer worksheet or textbook type assignments and more opportunities for students to collaborate with each other, create and share products that are the result of problem solving and learn through experience. At home this might look like allowing your child to explore a problem and guide their thinking through questions; allow your child to safely fail and use this experience to approach a problem from a different direction; provide opportunities to build, experiment and then communicate with you about what they are learning.






Key changes to current traffic flow include:

- ~Afternoon pick up will be moved from the front doors of Morning Star to the curb area along the front of the building. This area will be supervised by a staff member.
- ~Curb-side parking along the front of Morning Star will be eliminated, providing extended space for drop off in the morning and pick up in the afternoon.
- ~Crosswalks will continue to be supervised by staff.
- ~We are working with Bozeman PD and our Facilities Supervisor to possibly eliminate part of the grass area along the eastern border of our property & straighten the line to increase the number of parking spaces.


