## Spotlight on Second Grade

Second grade students have been very busy with an array of learning activities! During the trip to Headwaters State Park activities integrating science, social studies, Indian Education for All, & geography included learning to use an atlatl, furs from native animals, Native American culture, & the history of the pictograph. Students were able to see how an area can be important to many different groups of people over time. Giant MT cookie maps were made to highlight major rivers, mountains, & cities to build geographic knowledge. Our study of the water cycle culminated in an inquiry based streamtable activity. These learning opportunities were possible through partnerships with the Gallatin Valley Watershed Council, MT Water Course, Americorp, and MT State Parks. Literature connections featured reading *Naya Nuki, the Girl Who Ran* as well as various Lewis & Clark texts. Our weekly Olweus class meetings solve friendship and playground problems through discussion. Technology connections have included Digital Citizenship lessons focused on our "tone of voice" in texting and emails – important skills for today's digital citizen!
