Parent Night on April 29 featured an example of a math lesson from 5th grade and an integrated ELA/Social Studies lesson. Parents and staff talked about the range of behavior supports available that ensure students are ready to learn and not distracted. We had an excellent discussion around a variety of topics including homework and parents' needs for guidance in how to help with math at home. We look forward to sharing a fall math parent night as a result of this feedback.

In order to provide students with a voice in the events, activities & learning opportunities at Morning Star, we are initiating a **Student Leadership Team**. We invite all current students in grades 2-4 to apply by completing an application and soliciting recommendations from two adults. Our Staff Leadership Team will review the applications & select representatives from each grade. Selected students will participate in spring leadership training that will prepare students for next year's work as leaders at Morning Star.

Spotlight on Kindergarten

Our kindergarteners are ALMOST FIRT GRADERS! Have you seen their beautiful artwork using pastels hanging in the hallway? They have become quite accomplished at using illustration to tell a story and writing with descriptive words. Their work in persuasive writing is convincing and a long way from where they all started in September. In math they are actively using addition and subtraction to solve problems and create problems for others to solve. Number Talks continue to challenge and extend their thinking about numbers. Our mini scientists are growing bean plants from seed, exploring the parts of the plants, measuring them as they grow and learning about why plants are considered living. iPads and laptops are important learning devices, providing students with an opportunity to practice concepts such as addition, subtraction, sorting, ordering and matching. Digital citizenship lessons include the ABCs of safe searching and how to stay safe in an online environment.
