Speed Limit - The Bozeman Police Department has asked us to remind you all that the speed limits on S. 3rd, Arnold and Westridge are **25 mph**. When you cross Westridge on Arnold the speed limit drops to **15 mph**. The results of the NAEP-TIMSS Linking Study affirms that Montana's Public Schools provide top level performance for below average costs to Montana families and communities. Check out the details of the latest study which shows Montana 8th graders in the top 5 in Science and the top 8 in math when compared to 47 countries and jurisdictions worldwide, and do so at an efficient cost when compared to the rest of the nation.

Help us improve air quality around our school! *Did you know*?

- Idling for 10 seconds uses the same amount of gas as restarting your car. Most people waste one to two entire tanks of gas every year by idling.
- Manufacturers assure that frequent restarting won't harm an engine.
- The City of Bozeman and First Student (Bozeman school buses) have no-idling policies for their fleet.
- It is illegal to leave an idling car unattended in Montana (*MCA 61-8-357*).

What can you do?

- As a rule of thumb, if you are going to be stopped for more than 30 seconds at drop-off or pick-up times, turn your vehicle off.
- Pledge to not idle unnecessarily any time, any place.

Capital Improvement and Reserve Fund Planning

The Financial Advisory Committee (FAC) is a group of parent volunteers charged with reviewing PAC financials and providing direction to the PAC officers and Morning Star parent community for funds to be put forth for capital improvements, and those funds held in reserve to insure the long term viability of the PAC to serve the school. The current financial committee will be meeting soon, and make a recommendation to allocate funds for both the reserve account and capital improvement projects. This allocation will be reviewed and put to vote at the November 21st PAC meeting.

Is so, please go to the PAC website (www.msspac.com) to review the Morning Star PAC Capital Campaign Policy and other PAC Policies to help guide your development of a capital improvement initiative. Capital Improvement Proposals should be submitted to the PAC by the December 19th PAC meeting so the financial committee can review all proposals in January. The committee will make recommendations to the PAC on which initiates to pursue, and decisions on which proposals to implement at the February 20th meeting decided with a vote.
