#### Feedback from Student Leaders

As part of our commitment to engage students in problem solving and providing feedback, Mr. Starkey and I meet with our student leaders each month during lunch. We ask them what is going well that we can celebrate and what can we continue to work on/improve?

# ~In meetings with student leaders this week the kids shared the following concerns:

SPORTSMANSHIP: Football continues to be a problem sharing as a few kids want to limit who plays with them and celebrating in inappropriate ways; some girls are bringing makeup and nail polish to school; the Castle continues to be a problem with kids not following rules; some kids are kicking/throwing balls over the fence or into the parking lot on purpose and we are losing equipment that no one gets back

....And these successes: There is no/little bullying going on; people are getting along better - especially girls and boys welcoming each other to play together; most kids have a good friend at school - compared to last year when some kids didn't have friends to play with, especially younger kids; people are including others in play during recess; kids are getting better at staying behind the yellow line during pick up/drop off; kids are getting good at waiting for the bus to stop completely before moving to the doors; we like the new system for pick up/drop off – it gives more space for cars; lunch monitors are not rushing us, but are reminding us to finish up and go play; going outside for HE is fun; we like Fit Kids!

## Pick Up/Drop Off Safety

- If you are dropping off/picking up on the south side of the school please be considerate to our neighbors, drive safely and watch for the many walkers and wheelers.
- Student leaders report they like the new pick up/drop off system along the front curb as there is more room for cars at the curb and less time waiting.
- Our average time for all students to either walk/wheel or be picked up from school is now only 7 minutes – a great improvement over the average of 15-20 minutes last year. Please make sure you...
  - Pull to the curb and as far forward as possible before allowing your child to exit the passenger side of your vehicle.
  - Pull into the parking lot using the western-most entrance and park your vehicle if you are entering the building, even for a minute. This ensures traffic flow may continue.
  - Use the crosswalks whenever possible and be cognizant of the drivers around you we have had some close calls in the parking lot and need your help keeping everyone out of harm's way.
  - Avoid parking in the bus loop as our buses need the clearance to turn around and exit.
