Parking Lot Safety

Last year we formed a new Safety Committee comprised of our school resource officer, several parents and staff. As a result of the committee's recommendations we have revised our drop off and pick up procedures.

- Morning drop off is along the curb directly in front of Morning Star. An adult will supervise the sidewalk during drop off.
 - Enter the parking lot via the western most entrance.
 - Please pull up to the curb as far to the east as possible and allow your child to exit your vehicle from the curb-side door.
 - Students will follow the sidewalk around the building to the playground (supervised beginning at 8:00 a.m.).
- Afternoon pick up will begin at 3:30. An adult will supervise the sidewalk during pick up.
 - If you arrive early, please park on the north side of Arnold and turn off your vehicle as all Bozeman Schools are no-idle zones.
 - When you see your child, proceed slowly into the western most entrance and pull up along the curb as far east as possible. Your child will enter your vehicle by the curb-side door.
- There is no parking along the curb to allow for safe and timely loading and unloading of students. There is space for approximately 10 vehicles along the curb ensuring all student are picked up within 7-8 minutes of the dismissal bell.
- If you are dropping off an instrument or visiting/volunteering, please park in one of the spaces provided for our visitors.
