# **Principal Reports:**

## Kenesha Hardy – 4k Center

- Principal Hardy shared school updates:
  - 4k/5k Transitioning -Instructional Coaches meeting to facilitate alignment and seamless transition into 5k next school year
  - o April 14th -The Eggstravaganza had a big turn out!
    - Families followed rotations and learned different ways to create a literacy rich home
  - Currently planning for a June 23rd Summer Event

### **Eyvette Schrimmer – Elementary School**

- Principal Schrimmer shared school updates:
  - o Finished final benchmark assessments in early April
    - Benchmarks showed encouraging results -especially in math across the board
    - Will continue to close reading gaps due to covid -planning extra literacy professional development days next year with Expeditionary Learning curriculum
  - o Finalizing Summer Academy -5 weeks
    - 200 scholars already committed and inviting 100 more
    - TFA joining the Summer Academy for 3 weeks -our teachers will mentor and support
  - Continuing to grow communication with parents
    - Read Across Legacy Event was successful
      - We raised over \$6,000 in scholastic dollars
      - Our own, Mr. Cheek, was a guest author
      - There was a competition between the classes for who read the most books
    - Beginning the Watchdog Program
      - Currently in 7,000 schools nationally
      - Have 7 fathers so far
      - There are 2 objectives -to provide positive male role models and to provide extra sets of eyes and ears for enhanced security
  - o The Elementary Step Team has been performing at a number of family and school events
  - Last Friday -hosted tours of the elementary school for upcoming 4k scholars

#### Idasa Cobb - Middle School

- Principal Cobb shared school updates:
  - Hosted Various Events
    - Academic Celebration Ceremony -297 scholars were recognized
    - Gold Polo Banquet -96 scholars earned a gold honor polo
    - Life in the Middle Night -hosted 108 rising 5th grade scholars
  - State Testing begins next week
    - This week, the Middle School celebrates Spirit Week with a pep rally planned for Friday
  - The Middle School was recognized during a district meeting last week high MAP growth in ELA and Math

    - Benchmarks have shown some good results so far

  - Currently planning for a Legacy Family Night on May 26th at 5pm
  - o June 3rd -High School Graduation at Bob Jones University at 9am
  - The Dual Enrollment Program finished today
  - o Tomorrow, Legacy will find out if Deion Jamison will win the State Teacher of Year Award during the Gala in Columbia
  - Currently planning for Summer Classes to start up
