ANNUAL SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

BEEKMANTOWN CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

JULY 13, 1965

The Annual District Meeting of the inhabitants of Central Schoot District No.1, Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, Clinton County, New York, was held in the Gymnasium of the main school building at Beekmantown, New York, on Tuesday, July 13, 1965, at 7:30 P. M., EDST.

The meeting was called to order by the temporary Chairman, Board Vice President Robert Lyon at 7:36 P. M., who asked for nominations for permanent chairman of the meeting.

Upon motion made by Carmin D'Gregory and seconded by Marilyn Bartosek, Dr. Earl Harlan was nominated for permanent chairman.

Upon motion made by Ronald Wood and seconded by Ruth Ryan, Mr. Vernon Davidson was nominated for permanent chairman.

A motion that nominations for chairman be closed was made by Ruth Byan, seconded by Sharon Wood, and so carried.

A vote by show of hands was taken and counted by Attorney B. Loyal C*Connell as follows:

Whereupon Dr. Earl Harlan was declared permanent chairman and proceeded with the business of the meeting.

He read the official call of meeting as advertised in the local paper, the Plattsburgh Press Republican in accordance with the New York State Education Law, Section 2004.

The Chairman then asked for authorization to appoint the necessary assistant clerks and inspectors of election, and was authorized to do so upon motion made by Carmin D'Gregory, seconded by Kenneth Channell, and so carried.

SUGGESTIONS, INFORMATION, INSTRUCTIONS

- This Annual School Budget form is for use in all school districts, except City School Districts.
- 2. The new classification, coding and fund accounting apply to all school districts, but double-entry applies only to those districts with eight (8) or more teachers.
- 3. Page 1 provides information for action on the part of voters to authorize appropriations for the General Fund and to make necessary provision for Capital Reserve, Repair Reserve, Library Debt and Other Legal Purposes. Formal action on the BUDGET RESOLUTION by voters authorizes the Board of Education to expend the appropriations set forth in the BUDGET RESOLUTION.
- 4. Page 2 provides a summary of General Fund Appropriations broken down by major functions and objects of expense. This makes possible the accumulation of the total for each object such as, Personal Service, Equipment, etc.
- 5. Pages 3-5 show a Summary of General Fund Appropriations broken down by major functions and objects of expense.
- 6. Pages 6-16 provide a more detailed breakdown of General Fund Appropriations by major functions, functional units and objects of expense.
- 7. Page 17 provides for the determination of the total tax levy on Real Property.
- 8. Pages 18-21 provide the details of all revenues other than Real Property Taxes. (While it appears that there are a large number of revenue items, only applicable ones need to be used by each district.)
- 9. Page 22 provides supporting financial data for any General Fund Appropriation for the School Lunch Fund.
- 10. Page 23 provides supporting financial data for any General Fund Appropriation for the School Store Fund.
- 11. Page 24 provides General Information which assists voters to evaluate the proposed appropriations.
- 12. Four copies of this Annual School Budget form have been mailed to each school district.

BOND RESOLUTION ADOPTED THE 20th DAY OF JULY, 1965, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF A STATUTORY INSTALLMENT BOND OF CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 1, TOWNS OF BEEKMANTOWN, PLATTS-BURGH, CHAZY AND ALTONA, COUNTY OF CLINTON, STATE OF NEW YORK, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$29,118.75 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING FIVE SCHOOL BUSES.

WHEREAS, the voters of Central School District No. 1, Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, at a special district meeting duly called and held in the gymnasium of the Beekmantown Central School, Beekmantown, New York, at 7:30 p.m. on the 6th day of April, 1965, did duly vote and adopt a resolution by more than a two-thirds majority, authorizing the Board of Education of Central School District No. 1, Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, Clinton County, New York, to purchase six school buses and authorizing the expenditure therefor of a sum not exceeding Forty-five thousand (\$45,000.00) Dollars, which resolution reads as follows:

"RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Central School District No. 1, Towns of Beekmantown, Platts-burgh, Chazy and Altona, Clinton County, is hereby authorized and directed to purchase six (6) sixty capacity school buses and expend therefore a sum not exceeding \$45,000 as follows:

- 1 school bus at a cost not exceeding \$7,500.
- 1 school bus at a cost not exceeding \$7,500.
- 1 school bus at a cost not exceeding \$7,500.
- 1 school bus at a cost not exceeding \$7,500.
- 1 school bus at a cost not exceeding \$7,500.
- l school bus at a cost not exceeding \$7,500. which said total sum of \$45,000, or so much therec? as may be necessary, shall be raised by tax on the taxable property of the school district, to be collected in annual installments and to issue obligations of the district therefor in accordance with the Education Law and Local Finance Law."

WHEREAS, the said resolution was adopted by more than twothirds of the qualified voters present and voting at the meeting above mentioned, and

WHEREAS it is the desire of the Board of Education of Central School District No. 1, Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, Clinton County, New York, to purchase five of the authorized six buses, and

WHEREAS the proposed bond issue for the above mentioned five school buses will not bring the district total indebtedness above ten per cent (10%) of the aggregate value of the real property within the bounds of the district,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED this 20th day of July, 1965, by the Board of Education of Central School District No. 1, Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, Clinton County, New York, as follows:

ONE: For the object and purpose of purchasing five school buses for use in the Central School District No. 1, Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, County of Clinton, State of New York, and to provide funds to defray the costs thereof, which costs amounts to \$29,118.75, a statutory installment bond of said school district to be in the terms, form and content hereafter provided for, shall be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

TWO: \$29,118.75 is estimated as the maximum cost of the object or purpose for which such statutory installment bond is to be issued, to wit, the purchase of five school buses for the said school district.

THREE: The plan for financing of such object or purpose, to wit, the purchase of five school buses, consists of the issuance of a statutory installment bond of the said School District in the principal sum of \$29,118.75. Such bond shall be dated approximately as of the date of the delivery of the school buses and the power to fix and determine the exact date of such bond is hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education. The proposed maturity of the obligation authorized by this resolution will not be in excess of five years.

FOUR: It is hereby determined that the object or purpose for which said bond is to be issued falls within sub-paragraph 29 of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, and that the period of probably usefulness of said object or purpose, i.e. of each school bus, is five years.

FIVE: The said \$29,118.75 obligation represented by the statutory installment bond shall bear interest at the rate not exceeding three and one-half per centum (3 1/2%) per annum and the principal obligation of \$29,118.75 shall be paid in annual installments of \$5,823.75 on the ____ day of ____ in the years1966 through 1970 inclusive, and interest at a rate not to exceed three and one-half per cent (3 1/2%) per annum on the unpaid balance of said principal, shall be payable semi-annually. Interest will not be paid on any installment of principal or any interest after the due date thereof. Both installments of principal and the interest on said bond will be paid to the bearer of said bond in lawful money of the United States only upon presentation of said bond for notation of any such payment

at the office of the Manufacturers National Bank of Troy at its Plattsburgh branch.

SIX: Except as herein expressly provided for said installment bond shall be of the terms, form and content as the President
of the Board of Education shall determine, consistent, however,
with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

SEVEN: The president of the Board of Education of Central School District No. 1, Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, is hereby authorized and directed to sell such bond at private sale in the manner required by law.

EIGHT: When said bond will have been duly paid, the same shall be delivered by the president of the Board of Education to the purchaser upon payment to him of the purchase price, including accrued interest, and the receipt of the Board of Education shall be a full acquittal to said purchaser, who shall not be obliged to account for the application of the purchase money.

NINE: The faith and credit of said Central School District are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of said bond and the interest thereon when due. An amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bond as the same becomes due each year shall be included in the annual budget of said school district for the year and the said bond shall not be renewed.

TEN: This bond resolution is adopted in compliance with a vote of the duly qualified voters of Central School District No. 1, Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, at a special meeting duly held on the 6th day of April, 1965.

ELEVEN: This resolution shall take effect immediately.

He also stated that previous to this time the policy of the State Education Department had been NCT to approve services by 300ES to non-component districts which could have joined BOCES and didn't. This policy has now been changed so that certain specific services can be offered to non-component districts. He quoted the revised tuition rates as follows:

Persons residing is a communent district - \$500.00 per year.
Persons residing in non-component districts - \$500.00 plus an administrative charge of 124% or a total of \$552.50

He asked the Board and Nr. Gyan to meet with him in the near future to discuss sharing services with our district and the BCCES.

No coney was put in the 1965-66 budget for this purpose, but inassuch as five or six students have expressed interest in attending the Frais Center, the Sourd asked Nr. Byan to arrange a meeting with Dr. Harrold to discuss the offerings of the Board of Cooperative Educational Services.

- b) A telter from Mr. Arthur F. Ahr, Chief of Bureau of Industrial Arts Education regarding his visit to our Industrial Arts Department. He comptimented the Board for the progress made in complying with the recommendations made by Mr. Ultery as a result of his supervisory visit made in February.
- c) A letter from the Department of Public Welfare and Child Welfare
 Rervices concerning Jean Rivers. Jean has attended Beekmantown School

 She is now under the Child Welfare Department's supervision and resides

He also reported that one other second grade teacher will be needed for 1965-56 which will complete the staff with the exception of a $^{-100}$ Dental Hydrenist.

He then reported on the progress of the repairs on the three school buildings. He also stated that the boilers had been inspected today and recommendations made concerning them.

He then read an estimate submitted by Mr. Robert Christensen for the repairs to Mr. Albert LeBounty's bern in back of the West Chazy School.

The total estimate for material and tabor was not to exceed \$500.00

and he listed the repairs as follows:

11 Removal and replacement of damaged most (state removed and replaced with asphalt tab shinoles).

2) Remove 4. Clasboard along bottom of bern and replace with in exterior plywood covered with aluminum or delvanized sheeting.

3) Replace necessary studding where exposed to elements.

4) Remove 2: termoc next to building and replace with 4" perforated crangeburg embedded in crushed stone for water run-off.

The Board took no action because they fell a second estimate should be obtained before any finat decision is made.

They asked that someone else be contacted for another estimate.

Mr. Davidson was then asked if he wished to address the Beard. The stated that he was present in record to the Insurance Proposal he had presented to the Joans in April, which was a package deal which included all insurance except Student Accident and Athletic Insurance.

He understood that he was to meet with the Insurence Committee and wondered why he had beard nothing from them.

He stated that his Company had inspected the school buildings and had found acponent discrepancies in rates, especially at the Cumbertand Head School which was rated as a brick building instead of a fire reststive building.

He stated that his proposal was a \$1,000.00 decrease in premium plus an increase in coverace, plus a 15% discount due to it being a package deat, and he felt that the insurance should be with a local agent at the decreased cost. He added that his company pays no dividends but does pive lower rates. He later stated that although Firemen's Mutual pays a 40% dividend at the end of five years, they do have the use of that money for that time.

When asked regarding cates he stated that we are now paying a rate of \$3.30 per \$1,000, and that as a result of their investigation new classifications had been obtained on the school buildings.

A Fire Engineer from Glens Falls Insurance Company had inspected the buildings and upon his recommendations the rates had been changed as follows: Cumberland Head - .38 per \$1,000, Beekmantown School - .36 per \$1,000 and West Chazy School - .52 per \$1,000.

Questions were asked by Board Members as to whether other local agents could offer the same policy and rates and he agreed they could. He also acreed that Firements Mutual did not use his card rates.

After further discussion the opinion of the Roard was that all the local agents and Firemen's Mutual should be given the same chance to submit proposals before any decision is made, and the following action was taken.

RESOLUTION BY

That all interested local agents who are district residents and taxpayers, plus a representative from Firements Mutual Insurance Co. be invited to meet with the Board and the School Attorney to discuss and compare the cost and coverage of the entire school insurance program.

A special meeting of the Board of Education of the Beekmantown Central School District was held in the Board Room of the Main School Building on Wednesday, September 1, 1965, at 8:00 P. M., for the purpose of discussing the offerings of vocational education courses at the Area Trade and Technical Center which is operated by the Board of Cooperative Educational Services of Clinton County.

The meeting was called to order by President Harotd Luck at 8:25 P.M. Roll call of the Board was taken.

Present were: Harold Luck, Philomena Bartan, Kenneth Channell, Reiph. Recor and Donald Friedel.

Absent were: Robert Lyon, Joseph Lavorando, Sidney Duquette and Clarence Phair.

Also absent was Clerk Nary D'Gregory.
Also present was Superintendent Francis T. Ryan.

Mr. Ryan gave a brief report on the several meetings with Dr. John Harrold regarding vocational education with representatives of Boards of Education from Peru, Plattsburgh and Beekmantown, and the Board Meeting at which Dr. Harrold, Mr. Robert Joyce and Mr. Kenneth Leazott explained the ccurses in vocational education which are being offered at the Area Trade and Technical Center.

Mr. Ryan also reported on the meeting which was held with Mr. Welch, Guidance Counselor for the Area Trade and Technical Center, with Mr. John Stasgow and Mr. Merton Bromley in attendance.

In the conference with Mr, Welch, the following information was supplied by him:

- a) The school can accept three or four students in either morning or afternoon sessions in Appliance Repair and Graphic Arts.
- b) They can accept three or four students for full day programs in Practical Nursing and Cosmetology.
- c) They can accept three or four students in Distributive Educations a two year program which will be offered in the morning.
- d) They will give us two weeks after school begins to determine interest and select candidates.
- e) The candidates will be financially liable for tuition charge for the program if they withdraw after October 1st.
- f) Some area schools have assumed responsibility for post-graduate students. None of the non-member BOCES Schools (Peru, Beekmantown and Plattsburgh) have committed themselves.
- gl It is generally agreed that the eleventh year is the best place to begin the program, but BOCES has made arrangements for the 12th grade students to complete the Practical Nursing and the Cosmetology courses in one year, for this year only, inasmuch as the program is just beginning.

There was considerable discussion about sending pupils into the vocational center this year. The problems which would be encountered at this tate date were given careful consideration. After this discussion, the following action was taken.

A regular meeting of the Board of Education of the Beekmantown Central School District was held in the Board Room of the Main School Building on Tuesday, September 14, 1965, at 8:00 P. M.

The meeting was called to order by President Harold Luck at 8:05 P. M.

Roll call of the Board was taken.

Present were: Harold Luck, Philomena Harlan, Joseph Lavorando, Kenneth Channell, Donald Friedel, Ralph Recor and Robert Lyon.

Mr. Pyon then stated that Mrs. Therrien and Miss Brown were present to report concerning the Head Start Program which they fought

during the summer.

Both Mrs. Therrien and Miss Brown described the Program as being one of the most interesting and rewarding experiences they had ever had.

They discussed the entire program and related experiences with

both the children and the parents.

They discussed the curriculum and both teachers felt that it has all been a very definite help to the children entering kindergarten and hoped the program would continue in the future.

Mrs. Stode, one of the four teachers who attended the English Workshop at Vassar College during the summer, then reported concerning this workshop.

She praised highly the benefits and knowledge they derived from aftending.

She reported that time was spent in writing skills and thinking processes, literature study and reading study.

She discussed the main content of the workshop and stated that she felt that each teacher should be made aware of what is going on in all grades from K-12. She also thinks that verbal fluency should be taught and incorporated in every subject.

She reported that the English Curriculum is now being revised at Beekmantown, and Mr. Ryan stated that inasmuch/We were chosen as a pilot study school, time will be found for Principals, High School English and Elementary teachers to meet in regard to the entire English program.

Mrs. Hipko was then asked if she would like to address the Board. She stated that she was present in regard to her daughter Susan, who will be five years old on December 27, 1965.

She stated that Susan was advanced due to having attended Nursery School, and as she was unaware of the regulations required for entering Kindergarten she had called Mr. Frandino, Principal at Cumberland Head School, to see if Susan could enter in September.

He told her that pupils had to be five years old by December 1. but asked her to get an evaluation from the nursery school teacher to see if she was ready for Kindergarten, which she did.

She called again in July and Mr. Francino told her that Susan could be admitted and to bring the necessary papers to school to register her. She also received notices from the school in regard to the bus, the teacher etc.

After Susan had attended school for four days Mr. Francino had called and stated that there had been a misunderstanding, and that Susan could not attend school as she would not be five by December 1.

Mrs. Hipko felt that it was very unfair to the child to fell her now that she cannot attend schooland asked the Board if it would be possible for her to continue.

Mr. Ryan then stated that the present Board Policy was that a child must be five years old by December 1 of the year in which she enters kindergarten.

However, the Board felt that as long as a mistake had been made by the Principal and the child was registered and allowed to enter kindergarten, that she should be allowed to attend.

Some of the changes mentioned were regarding tile, ceiling, ramo coverings, pitched roof instead of flat, cork or carpet for the library, change in the athletic fields, aluminum windows etc.

Nr. Channell then reported concerning the installation of the dental chair, the necessary work on the water line etc. An estimate of approximately \$345.00 had been given by F. E. Chaskey for the work.

That F. E. Chaskey, Plattsburgh, N. Y. be employed for the installation of the dental chair and the necessary plumbing work in connection with the installation at a cost not to exceed \$345.00.

ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION ACT

TITLE I - The Disadvantaged (Covers both Public and Private School pupils in the district) Purpose: to provide financial assistance for areas with concentration of children from low income families to expand and improve their educational programs by various means to meet the needs of educationally deprived children.

- Low income children are defined as resident children, age 5 17 which families,
 - a. according to 1960 U.S. Census had incomes of less than \$2,000
 - b. according to the State Welfare Department received aid for families with dependent children of payments exceeding \$2,000 in 1962
- There is difficulty in determining where these children are located. District lines are not coterminous with town and county lines. (According to census of 1960 and State Welfare Rolls of 1962.) There were 1217 children in Clinton County.
- The amount which may be received for each of these children is estimated to be between 330 and 365 per child.
- Some of the programs which will be considered for approval by the State Education Department are:
 - a. Pre-kindergarten classes for three and four year old children. Summer school programs for disadvantaged.
 - b. Physical Fitness programs to improve mental and physical health.

- c. In-service programs for teachers employed in schools serving disadvantaged children.
- d. Identification of potential drop outs and development of curriculum and teaching procedure designed to keep them in school.

<u>Materials</u>. This title is authorized for five years. The first year the grant will be 8.3 million dollars for New York State.

This is broken down as follows:

- a. 7.1 million dollars will be allocated directly to the public schools and other public agencies. Other public agencies means, campus schools, schools for the blind, etc.
- b. Basic grant for school districts is \$1.75 per pupil of the K - 1?th grade children enrolled in the district. Fifty percent advanced payment will be made to school districts and subsequently the balance will be paid in two payments of 25% each.
- None of this money can be used for staffing, supplies, etc. Some of the money can be used for transportation of books, cataloging, etc.
- The allocation of money may be used for library books, including magazines, pamphlets, for audio visual materials (not equipment). There is a limit as to what may be spent in each category:

50% Library 25% Audio Visual 25% Textbooks

- Selection of materials A school district will have to write up selection policies and procedures.
- It will be noted that this title covers both public and private and parochial schools.
- It will be noted that this title states that there will be children in a school district whether they are in public, private or parochial schools.
- It will be further noted that the Beekmantown Central School District does not have any parochial schools within its boundaries. It will be up to the other school districts to count these children in their enrollments.
- TITLE III SUPPLEMENTARY EDUCATIONAL CENTERS AND SERVICES: provides grants for supplementary educational centers and services to stimulate and assist in the provision of vitally needed educational services not available in sufficient quantity or quality, and to stimulate and assist in the development and establishment of exemplary elementary and secondary school educational programs to serve as models for regular school programs.
- Definition: A Supplementary Educational Center is any formal or informal arrangement for providing one or more Supplementary Educational Services. A Supplementary Center or Service may encompass a large geographic area, or may be a program or service proposed by a single district or small number of districts.
- Purposes: The Supplementary Educational Centers and Services will be designed to meet three vital educational needs:

- to supplement educational programs and facilities which are not at present available in sufficient quantity.
- to stimulate progress toward the achievement of higher quality in education by providing better services than are currently available.
- to ensure that flexibility, innovation and experimentation become an integral part of our educational system.

Mr. Channell, Chairman of the Buildings and Grounds Committee, then reported that there is a wet spot in the drainage field caused by the bell on the syphon tank not working. This will be taken care of by F. E. Chaskey on Saturday.

He also discussed the work that needs to be done on the roof at the bus garage. He stated that there should be a new roof put on the second part of the garage, and that there is leaking in the garage and in one of the classrooms. An estimate for the work was submitted by Nonahan & Loughlin, Inc., but is over the \$2,500.00 limit.

Due to insufficient budget appropriations there was a discussion as to whether to put on a new roof or patch and repair the old one.

The decision was that Mr. Channell ask Monahan & Loughlin to come back and submit amother quotation for the necessary work that needs to be done now.

 $\mbox{\it Mr.}$ Channell also reported that the work has been completed on $\mbox{\it Mr.}$ LaBounty's barn in West Chazy.

Mr. Phair suggested that a release and a receipt be obtained from Mr. LaBounty, releasing the district from any further obligations.

Some of the Board did not feel this was necessary, but the Building and Grounds Committee was asked to contact Mr. LaBounty to see if the work done was satisfactory to him.

Nr. Ryan then reported that the Superintendents and the Principals have been meeting in report to Federal Aid Programs which he then discussed with the Board.

He explained that Title I is for Educationally Disadvantaged, the children who are below normal in their academic achievement and who fall in the lowest 30th percentile, and for the Economically Deprived, whose parents earn \$2,000 or less annually.

The total amount alloted to Clinton County from the Federal Government is \$444,983.88, of which Beekmantown District will receive \$57,493.23.

At this time 157 pupils are considered eligible at approximately \$365.64 per pupil.

Both parochial and private school students will be included.
A summer Elementary and Secondary Program has been suggested, with all schools sharing in the cost. Bus service will be provided to and from the place of instruction and might be contracted due to the separation of transportation costs that are necessary.

The suggested locations for the Junior-Senior High School Programs are:

1966 - Plattsburgh High Schoot

1967 - Peru Central School

1968 - Beekmantown Central School

The suggested centers for the Elementary Programs are:

Moders Central School - including Altona, Ellenburg and Champlain.
Beekmantown Central School - including Plattsburgh and Chazy.
Morrisonville Elementary School - including Saranac, Keeseville,
Peru, Dannemore and Lyon Mountain.

In regard to staffing, teachers from all the schools will be recommended by the respective principals and then approved and hired by the
Superintendents.

Mr. Ryan further stated that Title I cannot be run by the Board of Cooperative Educational Services, but that we can contract for services with them.

He state that our amplication has to be in by December 1, 1965, and asked for the approval of the Board for the use of Cumberland Head School for one of the Summer Elementary Programs.

RESOLUTION BY CLARENCE PHAIR:

That approval be given for the use of Cumberland Head Elementary School as one of the centers for the Summer Elementary Programs in Clinton County, under Project Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965.

SECONDED BY KENNETH CHANNELL

Resolution adopted by voice vote.(9 yes, 0 opposed, 0 absent)

Mr. Ryan then went on to explain that Title III is a tri-county wide program covering Clinton, Essex and Franklin counties.

This program does not go through the State Education Department but will be administered by the Cooperative Boards.

Six mitlion dotlars has been appropriated for the State of New York and rural areas have been promised a fair share.

The two programs being applied for are:

- 1) Center for Communications developing and coordinating program services for all the schools in audio-visual equipment and materials, films, filmstrips, audio tapes, possible audio-video tapes, commercial transparencies, program instruction and data processing.
- 2) In-service program for teachers in summer months who are working in special programs with exceptional children.

He also stated that if the counties do not use this money it goes back to the Federal Government.

Mr. Ryan then distributed mimeographed copies of an Evaluation of the 1963 Summer Reading Program to each Soard Member for their review and later discussion.

Mr. Channell then made a suggestion that a 'Teacher of the Year' be selected for outstanding services. The matter was discussed with most of the Board not in favor and no action was taken.

Mr. Ducuette, Chairman of the Athletic Committee, then asked if there could be a meeting of the Athletc Committees and Superintendents of Peru, Plattsburgh and Beekmantown to be held here at the school on Friday, October 29, 1965. The meeting was agreed upon for that date.

President Luck then asked if anything had been done regarding the purchase of the truck from V. S. Jerry & Sons which had been discussed at the last meeting.

Nr. Phair, Chairman of the Transportation Committee said he did not have a Committee meeting regarding this as no money for/equipment had been appropriated in the budget.

The matter was discussed at some length, budget items from which money could be transferred were reviewed, and the following action was taken.

Report of Superintendent to Board of Education

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION - AREA VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOOL

Several days ago, Mr. Bromley and Mr. Dailey and I visited the Area Vocational and Technical School in Plattsburgh.

In the old Finney building on Boynton Avenue, two programs are offered - Appliance Repair and Distributive Education (Salesmanship and Retail Selling).

Directly across from the Finney building, a course in Auto Mechanics is being offered.

At the building owned by Walter Church next to the VFW, 3 courses are offered - Graphic Arts, Cosmetology, Practical Nursing.

Mr. Izzo, Director of the Center, met with Mr. Bromley and I last week to inform us of the possibility of offering additional courses for next year. A copy of this list is attached. We have set up an assembly with our next year's 10th, 11th and 12th grade pupils at which time Mr. Izzo and his staff will be here to inform students about the courses offered and some of those which are proposed. They plan to use films and other media to orient pupils about the courses.

We plan to have students and parents who are interested in any of these courses work with our guidance staff to explain further about these programs and to set up the student programs in which some of the courses will be included.

ELEMENTARY & SECONDARY EDUCATION ACT TITLE III

In July of 1965, representatives from the following agencies in Franklin, Essex and Clinton Counties met at the Morrisonville School to discuss ways and means of applying for grants under Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965:

Other representative groups

Title III authorizes funds for grants -

"for supplementary educational centers and services, to stimulate and assist in the provision of vitally needed educational services not available in sufficient quantity or quality, and to stimulate and assist in the development and establishment of exemplary elementary and secondary school educational programs to serve as models for regular school programs."

In the planning of the program, the total estimated size of the groups (the number of persons) to be served by this proposed project is 152,774.

A substantive educational and cultural need that will be taken into account by this project is the planning for and the taking of other steps leading to the development of programs designed to provide supplementary educational activities and services such as:

- 1. Comprehensive guidance and counseling, remedial instruction, and school health, physical education, recreation, psychological, and social work, services designed to enable and encourage persons to enter, remain in, or re-enter educational programs, including the provision of special educational programs and study areas during periods when schoolsare not regularly in session:
- Comprehensive academic services and, where appropriate, vecational guidance and counseling, for continuing adult education;
- 3. Developing and conducting exemplary educational programs including dual enrollment programs, for the purpose of stimulating the adoption of improved or new educational programs including those programs described in section 503(a) (4) in the schools of the State:
- A. Specialized instruction and equipment for students interested in studying advanced scientific subjects, foreign languages, and other academic subjects which are not taught in the local schools or which can be provided more effectively on a centralized basis, or for persons who are handicapped or of preschool age;
- 5. Making available modern educational equipment and specially qualified personnel, including artists and musicians, on a temporary basis to public and other nonprofit schools, organizations, and institutions;
- 6. Developing, producing, and transmitting radio and television programs for classroom and other educational use;

- 7. Providing special educational and related services for persons who are in or from rural areas or who are or have been otherwise isolated from normal educational opportunities, including where appropriate, the provision of mobile educational services and equipment, special home study courses, radio, television, and related forms of instruction, and visiting teachers programs; and
- 8. Other specially designed educational programs which meet the purposes of this title.

The estimated cost of the proposed planning project is \$40,700.

The Committee recommended that the Board of Cooperative Educational Services apply for the grant and hire the necessary employees to work out the project.

The present application for one Operational Grant is an Educational Communications Center for the Tri-County Area.

Project Proposal -

A. Description of proposed project

1. Purpose

This is a proposal to set up a central depository of modern materials and equipment demended by upto-date instruction in the quality and quanity which would not otherwise be available because it is expensive and beyond the capacity of the average school.

2. Nature

The communications center would be housed in one building centrally located within the three counties so that all schools could be served daily. It will be operated by a professional staff who would also work very closely with the schools and other educational and cultural agencies. The materials furnished by the center would not be feasible financially for a single school to supply because they must be available in huge quanity and variety; also they must be maintained and refurbished under special conditions or by special staff.

3. Extent

Materials - It is recommended that the following materials, including duplicates, be made available the <u>first year</u>.

2000 motion picture films 1000 filmstrips

500 ready-made transparencies and equipment and materials for reproducing additional transparencies.

1000 tape and disc recordings

additions to these materials to be added in subsequent years; other materials to be added as needed, such as models, kits, dioramas, realis, programmed materials, etc.

Equipment - Regular and specialized equipment to be available on loans to the schools. This includes motion picture projectors, filmstrip and slide projectors, overhead and opaque projectors, phonographs, tape recorders, portable P.A. equipment, video tape recorders, T.V. camera chains, photography equipment, portable learning laboratories, etc.

> Regular and specialized equipment will also be housed at the center for pro-ducing special materials and operating the center.

Services to the schools include:

- Distribution of educational motion picture films. Distribution of filmstrips, recordings, transparencies, and other media. Distribution of regular and specialized audio-
- visual equipment.
- Production of instructional materials (graphics, transparancies, pictures, etc.)
- Tape duplicating service.
- Microfilming service.

- Equipment repair service and technical assistance. Daily pick-up and delivery service. Professional assistance and guidance (In-service training, workshops, consultations, research, curriculum development, etc.)
- Organized program for preview and evaluation of new materials and equipment.

Report of Superintendent to Board of Education

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE EXPERIMENTAL ENGLISH PROGRAM

At the opening of school in September, the teachers from our school who attended the summer workshop (Mrs. Glode, Mrs. Mischler, Mrs. Kennedy and Mrs. Toner) were requested to prepare an overview of the summer workshop program and have Mrs. Glode present this to the entire school faculty.

The objectives of the new curriculum were explained and, where applicable, teachers were asked to utilize the curriculum in their daily program.

Mrs. Glode, representing the four teachers who attended the workshop, explained some phases of what was accomplished to the Board of Education. Since that time, two meetings of the 4 teachers and the coordinator, Mr. James Proulx, were held at which times a system of presentation by the 4 teachers as a panel was devised and a breakdown of the various areas was presented to all elementary teachers and high school teachers at a general meeting.

It is planned, furthermore, that the panel of 4 teachers will work in an advisory capacity with each level (K-3; 4-6; 7-9; 10-12) at subsequent smaller meetings.

The articulated planning means that we are actually moving toward a sequential development of skills in which elementary school teachers understand the program for which they are laying the foundations and the secondary school teachers, in turn, understand the foundations upon which their program is built.

It is planned to have at least 6 meetings with teachers involved in the English program K-12. By the end of the present school year, all teachers concerned with the K-12 English program will have been deeply involved with the evaluation and the implementation of the program.

# AMENDMENT TO THE REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSIONER OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

*rticle XXV - is amended by the new section that follows, affective December 1, 1965.

193 Bye Safety Devices For Certain Students and Teachers.

From pupil, teacher, and visitor in every public or private school or other educational institution is required to wear industrial quality eye protective devices whenever he or she is participating or observing in an instructional or experimental program in a shop or laboratory involving:

Het solids, liquids, or molton metals; Milling, sawing, turning, shaping, cutting or stamping any solid materials; Heat treatment, tempering, or kiln firing of any metal or other materials; Gas or electric arc welding; Repair or servicing of any vehicle; Caustic or explosive chemicals or materials.

Each Board of Education shall adopt rules as to the time and place in the program at which the eye safety devices must be put on and may be removed.

Industrial quality eye protective devices as used in this Regulation means devices meeting the standards of the American Safety Code for Head, Eye, and Respiratory Protection, 22.1 - 1959, promulgated by the American Standards Association, Inc.*

The meeting was called to order by President Harold Luck at 8:15 P. N.

Roll call of the Board was taken.

Also present: Ar. Clarens, Retresentative from the Industrial
Appraisal Company and Br. & Brs. Sibley Esden, P.T.A. Members.

The minutes of the regular meeting held November 16, 1965, were read and accepted as read upon motion made by Kenneth Channell, seconded by Joseph Lavorando, and so carried.

The monthly financial Reports of the Clerk and Treasurer were then presented, including all district funds, and covering the period from 10 July 1 to December 1, 1965. (A copy of the Clerk's Report given to each Board Member.)

The monthly Financial Reports were accepted as presented upon motion made by Joseph Lavorando, seconded by Donald Friedel, and so carried.

The monthly Schedules of Claims and Payrolls were then presented for discussion and approvat.

RESOLUTION BY RALPH RECOR:

That the following Schedules of Claims and Payrolls be approved and paid as submitted in the arounts stated:

General Fund Schedule No.6 in the total amount of \$23,984.23 School Lunch Fund Schedule No.5 in the total amount of %6,891.71

SECONDED BY DONALD FRIEDEL

Resolution adopted by voice vote.(6 yes, 0 opposed, 3 absent)

Mr. J. G. Clemens from the Industrial Appraisal Company then addressed the Eoard in regard to their appraisal services for the fixed Assets Accounting mandated by the State Department.

Their services present two uses, one for appraisal values for fire insurance purposes to realize the most out of any loss by fire, and the other for the property record accounting.

They list by category totals rather than what is in each room, and they list ALL items regardless of cost or life. This is done by building and the school then only has to keep track of transfers between buildings.

He displayed the Property Record Form Reports and explained their use and contents. He also discussed the 4-pert pre-numbered Transfer Forms which are supplied by them.

He also stated that their report charts have been approved by both the State Education Department and the Department of Audit and Control.

The original billing would be a charge for the basic appraisal work of \$2,300.00, and charges for the Property Record Report of \$276.00, or a total of \$2,576.00. To this is added the annual service charge for insurance values of \$230.00, or a charge of \$150.00 without insurance values. With insurance values this would make the initial billing \$2,806.00.

Annually thereafter the service including insurance values would be \$230.00 or \$150.00 without insurance values, plus \$150.00 for a new Property Record Report.

He discussed insurance claims, proof of loss etc. and stated that their appraisal floures are generally accepted by the insurance companies.

He also reported that the State Education Department has changed the effective date of Fixed Assets Accounting. Boards must make provisions by

July 1, 1966, to have the inventory done, and the accounting must go into effect by July 1, 1967, instead of 7-1-66.

Mr. Clemens than left the meeting at 9:25 F. M. No final action regarding the appraisal was taken at this time.

Mr. Ryan then read a letter from Mr. Earl Burnelt requesting the use of the Gymnasium for basketball games on December 27th and 28th. The four leams playing would be the Northway Estate Team, McMartin Motors, The Profs and the Rangers. The proceeds from these games will go to the Senior Class of Beckmantown Central School.

RESCLUTION BY JOSEPH LAVORANDO:

That permission be crosted to Mr. Earl Burnell to use the school dymnasium for basketball dames on December 27 and 28 as per his request.

SECONDED BY KENNETH CHANNELL

Resolution adopted by voice vote.16 yes,0 orposed,3 absent!

Mr. Ryan then read a Fire Inspection Report from the Firemen's Mutual Insurance Company covering the main school building and the school bus parage.

He also read an Amendment to the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education concerning the wearing of protective eye devices in certain classes. (A copy of this Amendment is attached to the minutes of this meeting.)

Each Board is to adopt rules as to the time and place which the safety devices must be used, and Mr. Ryan stated that he had asked the teachers in these classrooms to meet with Mr. Glassow to make recommendations to serve as a guide for the Board in adopting proper rules.

In record to the new Textbook Law to provide books to parochial and private schools, Mr. Pyan reported that he had written to all the parochial schools where we have students in attendance to determine their needs and to arrive at a cost figure for next year.

The schools listed the number of publis as follows:

St. Alexanders - 17, St. Johns - 51, Mount Assumption Institute + 15, C.L.V.A. - 8, St. Feters - 51, or a total of 140 pupils.

The estimated cost of the textbooks is \$4,197.00, less \$1,400.00 State
Aid (\$10.00 per pupil) which leaves a District share of \$2,797.00.

Nr. Ryan then recommended the employment of Mrs. Marie Breyette to substitute for Mrs. Buth Dominy who will be leaving on maternity leave February 1, 1966.

RESOLUTION BY JOSEPH LAYORANDO:

That Mrs. Marie E. Breyette, Prospect Avenue, Plattsburgh, be employed as a full time substitute for Mrs. Ruth Dominy, Home Economics Teacher, effective February 1, 1966, for the remainder of the 1965-66 school year, and be paid at the annual rate of \$5,800.00.

For the Board's information Mr. Ryan reported that the classes being offered in Adult Education this semester are Sewing, High School Equivalency, Driver Education, Americanization, Modern Mathematics, Typing and Shorthand.

He then discussed briefly the plan for Health Classes for publis in 5th and 6th grades. The classes will be conducted by the school nurse teachers. The curriculum is being prepared and will be ready for Board review and approval in January.

Mr. Ryan also reported that Mr. Bromley, Guidance Director, had conducted a survey of students interested in the Area Trade and Technical School. Twenty-three students indicated a desire to attend the school in 1966-67 in the following classes: Cosmetology-7, Agricultural Mechanics-3, Auto Mechanics-6, Welding-1, Practical Nursing-3, Appliance Repair-2, and Bookkeeping and Accounting-1.

They will sow be located toward Poute 22 instead of toward the bus parage. He also pointed out a few other minor changes made in storage space etc.

Another Citizens Advisory Committee meeting was suggested with Architect Parker Dodge at a later date.

It is pointed out that any State Aid apportionment will be based only on payments made for textbooks on or after September 1, 1966.

School districts will need to maintain internal records for each individual child showing the amount expended for textbooks provided for them.

At present, any expenditure in excess of \$10.00 per child will NOT be considered for State Aid purposes, and payments made in 1966-67 will be reimbursed in 1967-68.

Mr. Ryan explained that School Administrators are endeavoring to have some phases of this Law revised which they feel are neither satisfactory nor beneficial to school districts.

Mr. Ryan then reported concerning the meeting with the Commissioner of Education in Albany on Friday, February 4, 1966, regarding State Ald.

Commissioner Allen reviewed legislation affecting State Ald and discussed the Items which were and were not included in the Governor's budget.

Also, Federal Aid Public Law 874 is to be cut back, possibly by one-third.

Regarding the aforementioned Textbook Law, it was reported that it is being revised and will be re-written and re-introduced.

Mr. Ryan also reported that districts are urging legislators to work for the payment of State Aid on a current expenditure basis.

A motion for adjournment was made by Kenneth Channell at 9:15 P.M., seconded by Donald Friedel, and so carried.

- In art classes when working with the kiln, glass cutting, grinding, buffing, or when heating materials, and be it further

RESOLVED, that industrial eye protective devices as used in this regulation means devices meeting the standards of the American Safety Code for head, eye, and respiratory protection, Z2.1-1959, promutgated by the American Standards Association, Inc., and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education shall cause to be provided storage cabinets and the necessary equipment for cleaning and steritizing the protective eye devices in each classroom where such devices are to be used, and be it further

RESCLVED, that a maximum of 40 such protective eye devices be purchased for each science, industrial arts or art classroom and that such eye classes be used interchangeably between classes with the instructor being responsible for seeing that the glasses are properly cleaned and stored after each usage.

Regarding the Work Study Program, Mr. Ryan explained that the District will have to pay their share of the Social Security Contributions, as well as the 10% District Contribution paid last year, on all our students working under that program.

A Special Meeting of the Board of Education of the Beekmantown Central School District was held in the Board Room of the Main School Building on Monday, March 21, 1966, at 8:00 P. M., for the purpose of adopting a new satary schedule for teachers, for consideration of the teachers eligible for tenure appointments, and other business.

The meeting was called to order by President Harold Luck at 8:10 P.  $\textit{M}_{\bullet}$ 

Roll call of the Board was taken.

Present were: Kenneth Channell, Sidney Duquette, Joseph Lavorando, Donald Friedel, Philomena Harlan and Harold Luck.

Absent: Raiph Recor, Robert Lyon and Clarence Phair.
Also present: Superintendent Francis Ryan and P.T.A. Wembers Mr.
Daniel Bickford and Mr. Kenneth Mills.

There was then a lengthy discussion regarding the new proposed salary schedule for teachers, which was presented by the Teachers Professional Advancement Committee at a meeting with the Teacher Committee of the Soard.

The Board Committee recommended the adoption of the schedule and also recommended the proposal that the salary increase be paid over a period of 2-3 years at the rate of \$250.00 per year until the salary corresponds with the proper step on which the teacher belongs.

Board Member Robert Lyon entered the meeting at 8:17 P. M.

It was also explained that if the total increase was paid in 1966-67, budget-wise, it would mean an additional amount of approximately \$109,675 over this years salaries. The Committee felt that this great an increase in the budget for teachers salaries could not be justified in one year.

If spread over a period of 2-3 years, the additional budget amount for 1966-67 will be approximately \$39,225 for the increase plus \$19,600 for the regular increments or a total of \$58,325.00.

After further discussion the following action was taken.

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize said improvement and to provide for the financing thereof in accordance with such proposition;

RESOLVED, by the Board of Education of Central School District No. 1 of the Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, Clinton County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The construction of an addition to the main school building of Central School District No. 1 of the Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, Clinton County, New York, located in the Town of Beekmantown, which addition consists of three parts, to-wit, the construction of additional classrooms on the main section of the main high school building, the expansion of the gymnasium and locker room - shower room facilities, and the construction of additional rooms on the clementary wing of the main building, including, in each case, original furnishings, equipment, machinery and apparatus, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$1,500,000.

Section 2. The plan for the financing of such maximum estimated cost consists of the issuance of \$1,500,000 serial bonds of said School District hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that subdivision 12(a,1) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law applies to the aforesaid specific object or purpose, and that the period of probable usefulness thereof is twenty years.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said Central School District No. 1 of the Towns of Beekmantown, Plattsburgh, Chazy and Altona, Clinton County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be lemied on all the taxable real property within said School District a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.



Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer.

Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said President of the Board of Education, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The validity of such bonds may be contested only if:

- 1) Such bonds are authorized for an object or purpose for which said School District is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such bonds are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

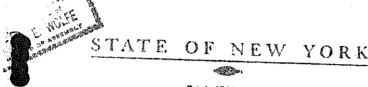

Opinion of Counsel No. 177

BEEKMANTOWN CENTRAL SCHOOL

May 25, 1966

To: City, Village and District Superintendents of Schools and Supervising Principals

Re: Chapter 348 of the Laws of 1966 relative to Minimum Salaries for Principals and other Professional Employees having Supervisory Responsibilities.

Chapter 348 of the Laws of 1966, effective July 1, 1966, repeals the Principal Salary Increase Law of 1964 (Section 3106-b of the Education Law) and enacts the following new provisions:

#### 1. New Schedules for Principals

Section 3103 of the Education Law is amended to require that in school districts employing 8 or more teachers, salary schedules must be adopted for principals which must provide for a minimum annual salary equal to that provided for a classroom teacher at the same step and having the same preparation, multiplied by 1.3. The Board may in its discretion, of course, provide for higher salaries than required. The schedules are 10-month schedules and if service is required in July or August,

the provisions of subdivision 3 of section 3101 are applicable.

#### 2. Definition

The term principal as used in the new law includes the principal of the district, butdoes not include superintendents of schools, vice principals, assistant principals or any person not acting as a principal fulltime.

### 3. Transition

A principal in service on July 1, 1966, must be transferred to the new schedule at the appropriate step in accordance with his years of service as a principal in the district. He is entitled to receive the amount of compensation commensurate with his years of service as a principal and preparation according to the schedule. The amount of salary to which a principal is entitled on June 30, 1966, cannot, however, be reduced.

In the case of a person newly appointed as a principal, the minimum would be step 1 of the teachers salary schedule multiplied by 1.3. In making the transition to the new schedule, the Board of Education is not required to increase the salary of any principal in the school year 1966-1967 by more than ten (10%) percent of the salary mid such principal in the current school year. The principal will be entitled to an increase of at least ten (10%) percent each year until hehas reached the smount to which he is entitled on the schedule.

If transfer credit was granted to a principal upon his appointment as a principal, such transfer credit must be included in determining his minimum salary. Service as a teacher in the district need not be included.

# 4. Schedules for Other Professional Employees Having Supervisory Responsibilities

The new law requires the adoption of separate schedules for other professional employees having supervisory responsibilities, which schedules must provide for minimum salaries higher than those provided for classroom teachers in the same year of service, including any differentials for advanced preparation. There is no fixed amount by which such schedules must exceed those for classroom teachers.

### 5. Filing

The schedule adopted pursuant to the new statute must be filed with the Commissioner of Education within 30 days after the adoption thereof, but not later than October 1, 1966.

Mr. Lewis stated that there was no objection to the sale of the property by the Community Club Association. He also stated that it can be sold without a vote of Former District #5 because the school as such has been discontinued for over five (5) years. (Section 1804-Subdivision 6)

Mr. Lewis feels that the Central District should try to obtain a quit-claim deed from the Community Association, and he will try to contact the officers of the Association to get a deed to the property.

Mr. Lavorando then reported concerning the Cafeteria Committee meeting held prior th tonight's meeting.

There is very little, if any, surplus food expected next year, which will necessitate either subsidizing the School Lunch Fund in the General Fund Budget or increasing the cost of meals for next year. By raising the cost 5d per meal, an additional income of approximately 311~12,000 should be realized.

The Cafeteria Committee recommends the 5¢ increase in the cost of meats rather than having to add that papernt to the General Fund Budget.

RESCULTION BY JOSEPH LAYOSANDO:

That the cost of meats in the Celeteria be increased 5¢ per meal, effective in September, 1966, making the cost of student meats 30v and the adult meats 40v each.

Mr. Channell then reported concerning the opening of the bids for the new school addition. He read the amounts of the bids submitted and stated that NO bid for Sewace Disposal Work was submitted.

The Committee felt that nothing can be done until bids for the Sewbor Work have been received.

A copy of the bid tabulation showing all the bids submitted is attached to the minutes of this meeting.

Fresident tuck then asked if the visitors wished to address the Soard.

Mrs. Equanty them asked why Science and Mathematics were taken out of the Secondary Summer School Program.

Mr. Ryan then explained that this program is paid for from Federal Funds only, and is not underwritten by the District. Therefore, the Government determines and sets up the program they think best, which then must be approved by the State Education Department.

He went on to explain that if Summer School Programs are underwritten by the district fultion must be charged.

Mrs. Focusty asked if there might be a possibility of having something like this to help the students who are slow learners but who might improve by attending such a school.

Mr. Ryan stated that this type of school may be here later, but would have to be set up with State regulations, regents etc.

Wrs. Esparty then asked for enrollment figures for next year, and was told that the enrollment would be approximately 2,300 for the three schools.

She then objected to the North Plattsburgh Youth Commission using the baseball field at the school for Babe Ruth and Senior Teams. She stated that the Youth Commission has an agreement with the Town of Plattsburgh for the upkeep of a field for these teams and felt that this was a cost ductication by using both.

The Board explained that they felt that the Youth Commissions of all four towns should be treated equally and the same privileges granted if requested.

Mr. Lyon subdested that Mrs. Fogarty bring this to the attention of Mr. Garrow, Youth Commission Director, and report back to the Board.

Mr. Rose then entered a comptaint about Bus #58 whose arrival time varies 20-25 minutes when picking up his children.

He also expressed complaints regarding other bus drivers and the unauthorized use of buses. However, he failed to observe the bus numbers and didn't know the drivers.

Both Mrs. Engarty and Mr. Rose objected to the 4-H Clubs using the buses to no to Cornell. Mr. Phair explained that area schools have always taken turns traning buses for this trip each year and listed the districts who had furnished buses in previous years.

Attorney Lewis assured them that the buses are being used tegitly and referred to Section 1709 - Sub-division 25 governing the use of school buser.

After considerable discussion regarding all the above complaints a motion for adjournment was made at 10:35 P. M. by Donald Friedel, seconded by Kenneth Channell, and so carried.

#### MEMORANDUM TO BOARD OF EDUCATION OF BEEKMANTOWN CENTRAL SCHOOL.

INQUIRY:

A question has been asked as to whether or not the busses belonging to the Beekmantown Central School may be leased to the Cooperative Extension Association of Clinton County for the purpose of transporting youth of the 4-H Movement to Cornell University for purposes of 4-H.

RELEVANT SECTIONS OF LAW:

#### Section 1709 EDUCATION LAW:

This section sets forth the powers and duties of Boards of Education, and Subdivision 25 specifically provides that when not needed for the transportation of school children, that a motor vehicle may be leased to a school district or municipality for the purpose of transporting children and instructors in connection with,

- (a) A recreation project or a youth service project operated by one or more municipalities, or by a school district if such project is authorized and approved by the State Youth Commission, or
- (b) A youth bureau or agency or activity or project of a county, town, city or village which is devoted to the welfare of youth therein, or to providing leisure time activities for youth or assistance to children as authorized in Section 95 of the General Municipal Law, or,
- (c) (Does not apply).

This subdivision further provides that "in any case, when such motor vehicle shall be leased as provided in

this subdivision, public liability and property damage insurance, fire insurance and compensation insurance of drivers, shall be provided in the amounts stated in Section 3627 of the Education Law, and collision insurance shall be provided in the amount of the value of the vehicle to protect the lessor. The additional cost of such insurance shall be paid by the Lessee.

No part of the costs and expenses resulting from operation, maintenance and repair of such vehicle during the leasing thereof shall be included in determining the amount of any form of State Aid received by such School District".

## SECTION 95, GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW:

This section, entitled "Youth agencies and assistance", provides that, "Any municipality as defined by section two hundred forty of this chapter is hereby authorized and empowered to establish, maintain and operate a bureau or agency thereof for the purpose of coordinating and supplementing the activities of public and private agencies devoted in whole or in part to the welfare and protection of youth therein, and to undertake and promote activities and establish, maintain and operate projects devoted in whole or in part to providing leisure-time activities for youth or assistance to children. Any municipality as defined by section two hundred forty of this chapter may appropriate, raise and expend moneys for the purposes of establishing, maintaining and operating such bureau or such agency, and may also receive and expend moneys fron the state,

the federal government or private individuals, corporations or associations for such purposes".

## SECTION 240, GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW:

This article shall apply to cities of the second and third class, to any county outside of the city of New York, and to towns and villages. Theterm "municipality" as used in this article, includes only a city of the second and third class, any county outside the city of New York, a village, town or that part of a town not included within the boundaries of a village".

### SECTION 224, COUNTY LAW:

This section, and particularly Section 8(b) thereof, provides for the County Extension Service Association, and this is the actual group with which we are concerned, 4-H being a division of the Cooperative Extension Service.

OPINION:

Based upon the foregoing, it is the opinion of the undersigned that the 4-H group is a division of the Cooperative Extension Service Association of Clinton County as defined in Section 224 of the County Law.

4-H is devoted to the welfare of youth and by Section 95 of the General Municipal Law, this is an agency, activity or project of a county devoted to the welfare of youth so as to make this a lawful activity under Section 1709 of the Education Law, and the Edekmantown School Board of Education may enter into a lease with the Clinton County Cooperative Extension Service Association for the lease of one or more busses of the

school for the purpose of transporting members of the
4-H Club, a division of said County Cooperative Extension
Association to and from Cornell University, provided that
the requirements of Section 1709 as to public liability,
property damage, fire insurance and compensation
insurance are met.

Architect Parker Dadge then proceeded with the opening of the bids as follows: (Rid bonds enclosed)

2. F. W. Jenkins & Sons Base bid: \$56,444 Pinttopurch, New York Attendate \$0-1: - \$2,040.00 (Deduct)

The bids were referred to Committee for further study and Mr. Marcus, Mr. Fobare and Mr. Jankins left the meeting at R:10 P. M.

The Architect then discussed the entire project at length with the Roard. They discussed detetions, afternates, total cost etc.

If the desired atternates are accepted there would be a shortage of approximately 333,000 in the entire cost.

Mr. Dodge also reported that Fobare & Sons, low bidder on the Plumbing Work, will not do the work at the bid price submitted due to a minimum wase scale increase since the submission of his bid. For them to accept the contract there would have to be an increase in cost of \$4,700.00.

The contractor, Ar. Fobare, was called at this time, and will meet with the Architect in the morning and with decide whether or not he will withdraw his bid.
