Important Additional Information:

- **Registration:** The registration dates and times at your school fall within the registration timeline noted above and are determined by the high school and in collaboration with Clinton Community College. Retroactive registration will not occur and the student cannot receive credit for a course they did not register for within the semester deadlines outlined in the College approved CAP Calendar.
- **Add/Drop Period:** The student cannot receive retroactive course credit after add/drop dates. The student can only receive credit for a course within the same billing semester in which they registered and paid for the course.
- **Final Grades:** Final grades are posted on the CCC Student Portal.



Clinton Community College - CAP Scholarship



Eligibility:

To be eligible high school students taking classes through the College Advancement Program (CAP). The scholarship award may not exceed three courses per semester. The amount of the scholarship will vary each semester and depend on the amount available and the number of students applying. To qualify for the scholarship, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be a junior or senior in high school,
- Demonstrate financial need or extenuating circumstance*
- Register for at least one CAP class

**Documentation of financial need must be presented by the school official completing the financial need portion of the application. It should be noted that if a student does not meet the qualifications for the governmental assistance programs listed on the application, they still may qualify for a scholarship.*

Deadline:

- September 29, 2021 for fall semester
- February 18, 2022 for spring semester
