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The Newman School is a co-ed independent day school for approximately 225 students in grades 7-12. Newman was founded in 1945 on the teachings and philosophy of Cardinal Newman. Located in the heart of Boston's Back Bay, Newman is an urban school with a diversity of learners from all backgrounds. Newman teaches the rigorous International Baccalaureate (IB) curriculum centered on project-based learning, self-discovery, and civic and international mindedness. Newman is one of the only fully IB independent schools in the Northeast.

\*Due to the impact that Covid has had on our community, Newman held hybrid classes to accommodate various students' needs. Some students were required to take classes online; others were able to attend in person. All students received letter grades, with the exception of those for whom Covid imposed excessive burdens. These students will be addressed in the counselor statement. For this reason, we are also removing means and median Standardized test scores because data does not represent a clear picture of the Class of 2022.

International Baccalaureate Stats: 91% success rate of IB diploma candidates.

Minimum Graduation Requirements:

Total of 24 year-long courses, 17 of which are core classes required as listed below, plus 7 elective courses of the students choosing

- 4 years of English
4 years of Mathematics
3 years of Laboratory Science, with at least 1 year in an IB science
3 years of Social Sciences - including Global Studies, US History, with at least 1 year in an IB course
3 years in Language Acquisition

Required Co-Curriculum Programs: Including Theory of Knowledge, Extended Essay, and Creativity, Action and Service Requirements for IB Diploma candidates, as well as capstone, thesis, community service and performance requirements are part of graduation requirements for all students.

GPA Weighting: The Newman School does not weigh classes. All GPAs are given on a 0.0-4.0 scale.

Ranking: The Newman School does not rank students.

Course Offerings for Grades 9-12

■ Students in grades 9-12 participate in the Middle Years Program (MYP) while students in grades 11-12 participate in course through the IB Diploma program. 9th and 10th grade students follow our standard curriculum and have choice over an elective course, and which world language they study. In general, 11th and 12th grade students take three Standard Level (SL) courses, and three Higher Level (HL) courses. Courses which teach both curriculums are listed as HL/SL Students select which courses to take at which level.
