Parent Guide to Standards Based Report Cards

Liberty Elementary School utilizes a standards-based grading and reporting system for all 1st and 2nd grade students. Standards-based report cards inform how students are performing on a set of clearly defined grade-level standards. Unlike traditional report cards, standards-based grading measures students' knowledge of material by reporting the most recent, consistent level of performance on grade-level content standards. The following assessment methods may be utilized to determine your child's progress toward mastery of the standards:

- common written assessments (formative and summative)
- student performance and participation during class activities and discussions
- performance tasks
- teacher observation (whole group and small group)
- one-on-one assessments (teacher and student)
- class work, projects, and writing samples

The grading scale is as follows:

Exceeds E - Student consistently and independently demonstrates the ability to produce work at a higher level than the grade level standard indicates.

Meets M - Student consistently demonstrates mastery of the grade level standard.

Progressing P - Student is working toward mastery of the grade level standard but is not yet consistent.

Not Meeting N - Student is unable to demonstrate mastery of the grade level standard.

The goal for students at each grade level is to reach an M (Meets) in all areas by the end of the school year.

For Students:

- Learning targets are clearly defined and aligned with state standards.
- Students are offered multiple opportunities and ways to demonstrate proficiency

For Parents
