- ❖ Mrs. Parsons Pre-School Update First, thank you to Melody McLoughlin, Special Education Secretary for all of her help in preparation for the 2019 2020 pre-school lottery. There are 67 applicants for the 2019 2020 prek program (3 half-day classes and 1 full day Smart Start Class (grant funded). There are 18 full-time students for the Smart Start Class. Half of the applications indicate full day services. There are 20 students on the wait list. Letters will be mailed to parents on Friday, March 15, 2019 with a short turnaround time for replies.

- ❖ Update on Grade 2 Tutor at Plymouth Center School Individual is on a full day schedule from 8:45 a.m. − 3:10 p.m./5 days per week; official start date for full coverage was on February 25, 2019; students are broken up into 2 groups for traveling (i.e. bathroom trips, specials and lunch); smaller groups are used to be strategic regarding instruction during the day; during the entire group instruction the classroom teacher is providing mini lessons, etc.; the tutor monitors student behavior, group work, independent practice and some small group instruction occurs with the additional support of an additional tutor that the school has in the Math. There are two other instructional tutors that have been at Plymouth Center School for a long time. They are used in this classroom as well to provide additional support. In addition, groups do not remain the same; they are broken up different ways.
