### Help Your Child Avoid Test Anxiety

The word **test** can cause a certain amount of stress in any student, no matter how well she is doing in school. Confidence and a positive attitude are key to overcoming it — and parents can help on both counts. Consider sports. You take your child to practice, where she learns the rules of her game. You cheer for her to urge her toward success. When she does well, you celebrate. When she doesn't, you encourage her to practice and try again.

You can help your child overcome test anxiety the same way. First, talk about what the school is expecting her to learn and be able to do. You can find this out by talking to her teacher. Ask the teacher how you can help build your child's confidence — and what

material you can review with her. Encourage your child every step along the way as she builds knowledge.

If you are preparing your child for state tests, ask his teacher how to help him understand what the tests will look like. Also, the teacher can explain how you can work with your child at home on the Ohio Department of Education's student practice resources and practice tests.

It's important to remember that Ohio's State Tests are based on Ohio's Learning Standards. These standards lay out what students should know and be able to do in each grade. Ohio teachers choose questions for state tests that match what their students are learning in their classrooms. This is your child's opportunity to show what she has learned throughout the school year. Keeping this in mind, your child should go into test day with confidence.

Finally, put every test in its proper place. We should all try to do our best on a test, but we shouldn't allow the test to terrify us. No single test — even at the end of a school year — can

have lifelong consequences for your child. Explain to your child that she wants to do well to show herself what she has learned — not to keep something terrible from happening. Your school should support her in the same way.

Helping your child build confidence and putting tests in their proper perspective will ease the pressure on your child when test days roll around. It also will give her a better overall school experience.

### Kindergarten Registration/Enrollment For the 2017-2018 School Year



#### **STEP 1: REGISTRATION:**

**Date:** Monday, March 13 – Friday, April 7

**Who:** Children 5 years old on or before August 1, 2017

**Where:** Register online at [www.troy.k12.oh.us](http://www.troy.k12.oh.us) Click on “online enrollment form” on the left side of the district homepage. Provide all information requested on the forms through this link. \*\*\*If you do not have online access, forms can be picked up and returned at the Board of Education Office at 500 N. Market Street.

#### **STEP 2: ENROLLMENT** (after completing step 1 above):

After completing the registration forms, it is necessary to provide the documentation below to complete the enrollment process. Forms can be dropped off at specific times at the school building of attendance on the dates below. If you are unsure which building your child will attend, you can contact the Board of Education Office at 332-6700.

<b><u>Where:</u></b>	Concord - April 18 noon-6:00pm	Kyle - April 18 4:00-6:00pm
	Hook - April 19 4:00-6:00pm	Cookson - April 19 4:00-6:00pm
	Heywood - April 20 4:00-6:00pm	Forest - April 20 4:00-6:00pm

#### **What to bring:**

- ✓ Birth certificate (passport, certificate of baptism or other birth affidavit) confirming your child was born on or before August 1, 2012.
- ✓ Custody papers (if applicable)
- ✓ Immunization records
- ✓ Preschool or previous kindergarten history
- ✓ Photo I.D. of enrolling party
- ✓ Proof of residence (example: lease, mortgage document, utility bill, etc. with name of the parent/guardian enrolling the child)

By bringing all the above with you, you will be able to complete the process for your child to be enrolled. If you are unable to provide all necessary information at the time of registration, the school will enroll your child when all forms have been completed and returned to your child’s home school.

Your child must have a physical examination authorized by a licensed physician BEFORE the first day of school. The examination should occur within one year of the start of the school year. Forms are available at the end online registration form, at the Board of Education Office, and at all elementary buildings.

**Note:** Foster children need to be registered through Children’s Services and enrolled by a caseworker.

**Open Enrollment:** Parents must enroll their child in their home school or home district. Open enrollment requests will not be accepted at this time, there is a separate process for open enrollment. If you wish to apply for open enrollment, please call the Board of Education office at 332-6700. The window for submitting these applications is April 17-May12.

***Children do not need to attend for enrollment.***

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If you cannot attend Kindergarten Enrollment at your child’s school on the dates listed, please contact the Board of Education Office at 332-6700 to make an appointment prior to May 26.
