Introduction

Dear reader,

In an environment where digitalisation has become an important channel of communication, the Dutch International Schools hereby announces a new way to publish their 'annual report' which is restricted to student numbers only. All other relevant information can be found through the website www.dutchinternationalschools.nl. (Student numbers are published on the website too.) We believe that it is important to share with you how our schools develop. Every school has its own unique position. Next to that, we believe that another important consideration to share our information digitally is to do that in a more sustainable way.

Overview of schools

In recent years a lot has happened. For example, a number of new Dutch International Schools have started. On our website you can find a map where you can look up all different schools and compare them with each other. You can easily search by preferences: per municipality, only Primary education, only Primary & Secondary education etc. At a glance you can see where the Dutch International Schools are located and what individual characteristics each school has. And by clicking on the school, you will be linked to its own individual website.

Number of students

Like the rest of the world, we have had to deal with two Covid years, which has had an impact on the Dutch International Schools. The student developments show that – after previous years of strong increase – the number of students at the Dutch International Primary schools has stabilised and, in some schools, has shrunk somewhat.

The overall number of students at the Dutch International Secondary schools continued to grow. Although that has also been to a slightly lighter extent than in previous years.

The development in total student numbers seems to be partly explained by the Covid pandemic. Many internationally mobile families have chosen, from a public health point of view, to postpone their movements. Significantly fewer internationals came to the Netherlands, there was also a large period of many travel restrictions (in 2020) and a number of internationals have returned to their country of origin to be with family. Some recovery is expected in the coming years, although at this stage it is still unclear what consequences Covid will have for global mobility in the longer term. Another important trend is that particularly families who plan to stay in the Netherlands for an extended period of time (with children of primary school age), more often choose for general Dutch primary schools, with or without an internationalised profile.

Education

The Dutch International Schools will continue to focus on the qualities they have: attention to global citizenship, continuous learning lines for the benefit of international children and their high level of education. We will continue to offer the high-quality education that the Dutch International Schools have become known for. In a national environment where more and more attention is paid to alternative options of international education, this will be an important topic. We welcome you to make use of our new style annual report.




