Michelle Pieper earned the win and shutout in goal for Notre Dame, who advances to play Father Gabriel Richard in the MHSAA District Final.

The Notre Dame Varsity Softball team swept a doubleheader from Royal Oak 8-3 and 13-3 on senior day. Ryann Simmonds picked up the win in the opening game, giving up only two earned runs while striking out three. Simmonds also added three hits, scored once and drove in two. Abby Hannan contributed a pair of hits, scored once and plated one run. Senior Jordan Smith had a single, scored twice and drove in one. Annie Wachowiak drove in a pair of runs with a line shot off of the center field wall and Stephanie Dzialo added a hit and an RBI. In game two, Wachowiak earned th win, giving up only an earned run an d striking out seven. Wachowiak added a two-run home run at the plate while scoring twice. Smith had two hits, an RBI and threw out a runner attempting to steal a base. Regina Roose had a pair of hits and an RBI, Hannan had two hits, Morgan Bissett scored twice and reached base in all three at-bats and Brooklyn Haddad collected her first Varsity hit and run scored.

GOLF PLACES SEVENTH AT MHSAA REGIONAL



NOTRE DAME RUNNERS COMPETE AT REGIONAL MEET

The Notre Dame Boys and Girls Track and Field teams competed in the MHSAA Division 2 regional meet at Williamston High School last Friday. The boys were led by sophomore Zach Mylenek, who placed third in the 400m dash with a time of 52.47. Earlier in the day, Mylenek placed fourth in the 100m dash final, after setting a new personal best 11.31 in the preliminary round. Senior Jack Olis placed fifth in the 300m hurdles while setting a new PR of 42.74. In the 4x400m relay, Mylenek, senior Josh Reid, senior Chris Galle, and Olis just missed a state qualification with a thrilling third place finish in a season best 3:33.00. For the girls, freshman Maria Nunning had a breakout performance with a fourth-place finish in the 1600m run in 5:43.88. In the same event, sophomore Zoe Hoke was right behind in 5:45.36. Nunning also competed in the 800m run and placed fifth in 2:39.26.Others notching PRs on the day included senior Jack Kautz, freshman Mark Galle, sophomore Alaina Byrne, freshman Isaak Brook, sophomore Lucas Mylenek, senior Frank Roth, senior Tyler Wojichowski, and Reid.

FRESHMEN COMPETE AT OAKLAND COUNTY MEET; BASEBALL TOPS DETROIT WESTERN IN EXTRA INNINGS

FRESHMAN RUNNERS HEAD TO OAKLAND COUNTY MEET

A group of Notre Dame Track and Field freshmen competed at the Freshmen Oakland County Championships at Milford High School earlier this week. Freshman Maria Nunning stole the show by becoming a Freshman Oakland County Champion in the girls 1600m run. Nunning won the event with a career best time of 5:35.04. Nunning followed that performance with an eighth-place finish in the 800m run in 2:36.26. Freshman Jake Gartin secured eighth place in the shot put with a throw of 33"0". In relays, freshman Christian Estrellas, Anthony Valentine, Samuel Phillips, and Mark Galle raced to a time of 1:46.70 in the 4x200m. The same group competed in the 4x100m run and logged a time of 53.55. Freshman Isaak Brook notched a personal record in the 1600m run with a time of 5:00.48, good for 18th place. Brook also competed in the 800m run and took fourth with a time of 2:17.65.

The Irish rallied from an early 3-0 deficit and capped the victory with a walk-off single from Ben Sermo in the bottom of the ninth inning. Jeremy Gale had three hits, scored twice and had an RBI. Gale also picked up the win on the mound, allowing only two runs over five innings of work in relief.

HOLLY SWEEPS DH FROM NOTRE DAME

The Notre Dame Varsity Softball team dropped both ends of a doubleheader to Holly. In the opener, Holly scored in the opening inning on a pair of hits and an error. The run would turn out to be the only scoring of the game as the Bronchos prevailed 1-0. Ryann Simmonds took the tough-luck loss in the circle, allowing only three hits while striking out three over seven innings. In the second game, both teams battled back-and-forth with a two-run home run by Holly in the top of the seventh inning proving to be the difference in a 6-5 Broncho win. Annie Wachowiak took the loss in the circle, giving up six runs (three earned) with five strikeouts. Wachowiak, Jordan Smith, Simmonds and Stephanie Dzialo each picked up a pair of hits while Audrey Thurman had a two out single that drove in two runs that gave the Irish a 3-2 lead in the fourth. Abby Hannan added an RBI single in the sixth and eventually scored as well on a Smith single.
