

ESSER I Information for the Website

Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER I):

Allowable usage of ESSER I funds per the federal government are as follows:

- Any activity authorized by the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965, such as Titles I-IV, Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Perkins CTE Act of 2006, etc.
- Coordination of preparedness and response efforts.
- Resources for principals and school leaders.
- Activities to address the unique needs of low-income students and/or students with disabilities.
- Developing and implementing procedures and systems to improve the preparedness and response efforts of districts.
- Training and professional development for staff on sanitation and minimizing the spread of infectious diseases.
- Purchasing supplies to sanitize and clean facilities.
- Planning for and coordinating during long-term closures, including how to provide meals to eligible students, how to provide technology for online learning to all students, how to provide guidance for carrying out requirements under IDEA, and how to ensure other educational services can continue to be provided consistent with all federal, state, and local requirements.
- Purchasing educational technology (including hardware, software, and connectivity) for students who are served by the local educational agency that aids in regular and substantive educational interaction between students and their classroom instructors, including low-income students and students with disabilities, which may include assistive technology or adaptive equipment.
- Providing mental health services and supports.
- Planning and implementing activities related to summer learning and supplemental after school programs.
- Other activities that are necessary to maintain the operation of and continuity of services in districts.

Note...Uses of funds highlighted in yellow are the areas in which we spent our ESSER I funds.

ESSER I Expenditures

The District was allocated \$440,176 in ESSER I funds, and all of those funds to date have been spent. A breakdown of the expenditures is as follows:

- Chromebooks & Licenses for Grades 1-4 = \$160,425
- WiFi Hotspots = \$17,318
- Zoom - Premium Access = \$8,900
- Chromebook Charging Stations for K-4 Classrooms = \$19,778
- Twin Valley Virtual Academy (TVVA) Tuition Costs = \$169,909
- Custodial Cleaning Supplies = \$6,053
- Cafeteria Cleaning Supplies = \$471
- Required Set Aside for Non-Public Schools = \$10,730
- Estatic Sprayer = \$3,448
- Cafeteria Tables = \$17,460
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) = \$23,355
- Trailer Rental = \$2,329
