


### **7th Grade Math**

This week, students have been completing their MAP testing for math to demonstrate their growth since the fall. MAP measures how much students have learned and gives teachers specific breakdowns in students' strengths and needs in specific areas. Students' scores are normed by comparing them to same age peers across the country. If you would like to see your child's MAP data, please email his or her teacher.



### **8th Grade Science**

During our first week of second semester in science students were given a list of materials, from which they were to build an earthquake proof structure that could withstand our “Shake Table”. This was a fantastic STEM introduction into Earth’s Interior and Plate Tectonics. The structures pictured were the winning designs from each class.



### **6th grade Math - Mr Coberly**

6th grade Math students are working through a Unit on Integers, Absolute Value, and the Coordinate Plane. Students are not only learning ways in which negative numbers apply to Math, but also their lives outside of school. As a challenge this week, see how many different real-life situations you and your student can come up with where both positive and negative numbers are used. To get you started, temperature is one example.

## **7th Grade Science**

First semester Science ended with a successful Roller Coaster exhibition. Students rose to the challenge and successfully built and designed roller coasters for the new Urbana Theme Park PBL. Second semester Science started off with a STEM challenge of creating straw rockets. They are currently working on analyzing their data to learn the steps of Scientific Inquiry.



## **6th grade Science**

In 6th grade Science we are happy to be back in the classroom lab. We are studying lab safety and material density in science. Did you know that proper lab safety dictates: "Washing your hands and lab equipment is the last step to cleaning up a lab"? Yes, this was true, even BEFORE Covid! Photos are from our 'Immiscible Liquids' lab. Students made observations and inferences of immiscible liquids, and made proper measurements in metric, both digitally and in the classroom. Students should be able to demonstrate this lab with materials you have at home. Refer to Google Classroom post 1/27/2021. Please look forward to students bringing home a sealed density tube.



## **6th grade math - Mr. Wall**

In 6th grade math, we finished out our unit on percentages by looking at real life applications such as sales tax, discounts and tips. We have moved into learning about positive and negative integers and will be using this knowledge to graph ordered pairs in all four quadrants of the coordinate plane.
