PANDEMIC

COVID-19 greatly impacted the 2019-2020 school year. In March 2020, within a 24-hour period, WWS administrators, teachers, and staff quickly pivoted to 100% on-line learning for ALL students for the remainder of the school year.

DISTRICT LETTER GRADE - A

The Indiana Department of Education released its school and district letter grades for 2019. **WWS as a district once again received an A overall**, based on criteria including ILEARN+ passing rates and student growth from one year to the next, graduation rates, and college and career readiness indicators. WWS's grade is reflective of the work the last two years to align and improve curriculum and instruction.

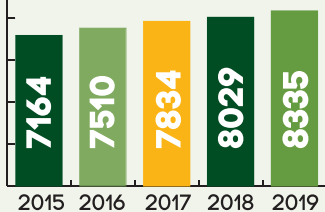

WESTFIELD MIDDLE SCHOOL

- Westfield Middle School is home to the only middle school sponsored dart club in Indiana, and the largest youth dart club in the country with over 40 participants.
- The 7th Grade Girls Basketball team won the Carmel Invitational. 8th Grade Girls Basketball were conference champs. 7th and 8th Grade Football won the Hamilton County Championships and the 7th and 8th grade Volleyball team won the county tournament. WMS Boys Cross Country Team was runner up for the Middle School State Championship.
- The WMS Yearbook won the top two awards in the country, making it a clean sweep for the yearbook national awards! It was voted BEST in the United States (out of over 600 entries). The yearbook also won the Pacemaker award, a designation awarded to only four yearbooks in the country in the 2019-2020 school year!
- For the 2nd year in a row Westfield Middle School was given a 2019-2020 Project Lead The Way (PLTW) Distinguished School designation.

OAK TRACE ELEMENTARY

The 2019-20 focus was on building community partnerships through community projects. Each grade level took on a different project:

- Kindergarten thanked community helpers throughout the year with cards of appreciation.
- First grade supported our local parks by learning about the importance of our natural spaces and cleaning and caring for them.
- Second grade visited Wellbrooke and Sanders Glen sharing Readers Theaters, poems, and songs.
- Third grade collected food for Open Doors and visited Open Doors to learn more about how they support our community.
- Fourth grade worked with the Hamilton County Humane Society making blankets and toys for animals, and created a Kindness mural in Asa Bales Park.



SHAMROCK SPRINGS ELEMENTARY

The focus for 2019-20 at Shamrock Springs was to create "families" and build a community and relationships with staff and students. Each family is made up of students across multiple grade levels along with staff members. During the family meetings, which are held approximately every other week, students get together for social and emotional learning activities, build relationships, and develop student leaders.
