


TRANSITIONAL CHANGES FROM ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TO MIDDLE SCHOOL

Elementary School	MIDDLE SCHOOL
Students have one primary teacher and up to three elective teachers which often rotate days.	Students have six different teachers a day, four academic teachers and two elective teachers.
Most academic subjects are taught by one teacher.	Each academic subject is taught by a different teacher.
All materials are kept in one room/desk.	Materials are kept in lockers and carried to six different classrooms.
Students get at least two recesses a day.	Students get one recess after lunch.
Students are "escorted" to elective classes by a teacher.	Students have a four-minute passing period to move between classes. Teachers monitor the hallways.
Students wear street clothes when participating in PE class.	Students change into gym clothes for PE classes. (gym lockers are issued)
Each academic teacher is responsible for approximately 30 students.	Each academic teacher is responsible for over 120 students.
A teacher schedules individual conferences for the parents of his/her 30 students.	Parents visit with each of their child's teachers during evening conferences.







PROGRAMS

Honors

Honors classes will be offered in Language Arts and Math. These courses are designed to challenge students and to prepare them for advanced placement classes at the high school. An application must be completed for Honors Language Arts before a student may be considered for placement.

*** The district places students in Honors Math based on a body of evidence that they collect from district/state assessments. You cannot sign up for Honors Math.

PAC

Lessons start with understanding the philosophy of self-concept, and move into an understanding about the Thoughts/Actions/Feelings
Circle
which illustrates how this works in life. The essence of PAC is to emphasize those actions that promote a healthy and positive cycle.

Special Education


