"A&P" by John Updike -A young man comes to a realization about his life through an interaction at work.

"The Lottery" by Shirley Jackson - A small village picks a winner.

"A Sound of Thunder" by Ray Bradbury - A man gambles with time travel.

<u>"The Things They Carried" by Tim O'Brien</u> - Soldiers wrestle with tangible and intangible things that they carry during the Vietnam War. Students only need to read the first chapter in the PDF.

"The Half Skinned Steer" by Annie Proulx -- A man is haunted by his past

"The Destructors" by Graham Green -- Gang of boys dismantle a house from the inside

"Araby" by James Joyce --a young man discovers a hard truth about himself.

<u>"Swallows" by David Huddle</u> --a young woman's experience at camp is formative.

A Perfect Day for Bananafish by JD Salinger -- A man shares a story with a young girl on the beach

A Temporary Matter by Jhumpa Lahiri -a young married couple struggle with their past.
