

REMEDICATION PLAN FOR PEVS

Impacted Students: In person and virtual students with learning loss were identified through statewide testing data, local assessment data, and team meetings with building staff.

Needs Assessment: Academic needs were addressed by comparing previous years' local assessment data to current data, examples include STAR Reading and Math Assessments and Ohio State's Tests. Building level discussions were held to identify at-risk students and formulate actions to provide adequate learning support. Student social emotional needs, attendance, behavior, and parental support were also guiding factors in identifying students that may benefit from learning loss programs.

Approaches: PEVS worked swiftly to plan and coordinate a two week summer program in June 2021 with plans to offer additional summer camps in June 2022 and 2023. Transportation, breakfast, lunch, and snacks were provided to alleviate any potential barriers for families. The summer camp consisted of small group tutoring in Reading and Math, Art/Music Enrichment, Physical Fitness, and 7 Mindsets (school wide social/emotional curriculum).

During the month of July, PEVS offered "Tuesday Tutoring". This was personalized 1:1 tutoring with a classroom teacher. The classroom teacher addressed learning gaps from the previous school year.

At the beginning of August, a "Back to School" one week camp was offered to the at-risk population.

In September, PEVS created an after school program modeled after a previous grant funded 21st CCLC program. A program coordinator was hired to secure site coordinators for each of the 3 PEVS buildings. After school program staff worked diligently to prioritize student recruitment, alignment of high quality curriculum that matched student needs, and a positive learning environment.

Partnerships: PEVS has partnered with Western Buckeye Educational Service Center, Paulding Carnegie Library, YMCA Camp Clay, Paulding County Soil and Water Conservation, and various other local agencies to further support student needs.

Alignment: Paulding Exempted Village Schools recognize that each student is a unique individual. We believe that it is our mission to provide students with opportunities and encouragement that permit students to develop their full potential as citizens of tomorrow. The interaction within a school system should provide students with concepts of respect, responsibility, courtesy, and individuality. The interaction within the school community should provide students with acceptance of others ideas, beliefs, and opinions. As our students leave and enter society, they will have the skills to become an integral part of the global community. The development of the above learning loss programs aligns with and reinforces the goals of our district wide mission statement.
