- Work collaboratively with the Learning support team when appropriate to ensure that all students are supported in the classroom.
- Offer regular, written, formative and summative feedback to support student progress.
- Encourage and maintain high standards of behaviour, punctuality and attendance by students.
- Contribute to the smooth running of the school through performing regular duties and being familiar with school policies.
- Participate in Personal Development Week (experiential education trip) and our Personal Development Programme (i.e, teaching PSHE, Homeroom or Service as Action), as well as our clubs and activities programme.

- Collaborate with colleagues to ensure departmental and school-wide philosophical alignment
- Collaborate within course teams to review, develop and refine the German courses to maximise and enhance student learning.
- Participate in departmental, divisional and schoolwide meetings.
- Engage with colleagues to deepen practice and learn from each other through regular meetings, lesson observations and professional development opportunities.
