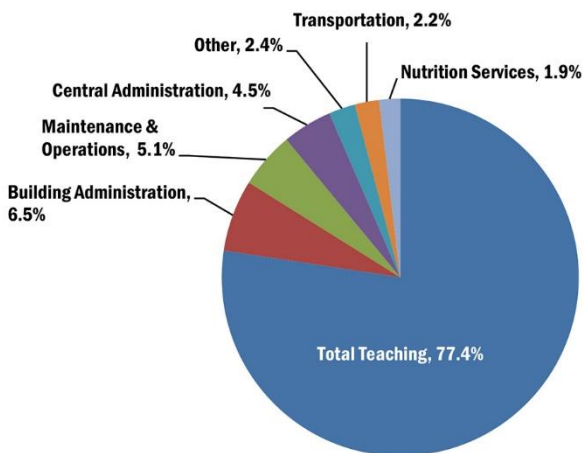

2020-21 School Goals

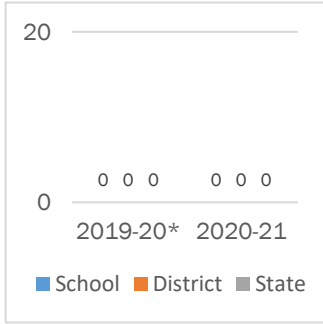
Teachers analyzed data for each academic area. They looked at state testing data and DIBELS scores over the past three years, whenever possible, to see the historic trends for each student. Based on this data, as well as classroom-based assessments, teachers set goals.

- Grades K-2 Reading: 87% at standard on end of year DIBELS
- Grades 3-5 English Language Arts: 85.5% at standard
- Grades 3-5 Math: 82% at standard
- Grade 5 science: 87% at standard
- Achievement gap: 62.6% of 3rd-5th grade Hispanic students will be proficient on the ELA SBA 2019 and 62.9% of K-2nd grade Hispanic students will be proficient on the End of Year 2019 DIBELS.
- School Effectiveness: Based on the Nine Characteristics of Highly Effective Schools Survey, "Student discipline is managed well," will increase from a weighted average of 2.2 out of 4 to a weighted score of 2.9 on the 2018-2019 survey.
- Attendance: Reduce the total number of daily average tardies by 10%
- Discipline: 80% of 60 randomly selected students (10 from each grade) will be able to accurately state the three behavioral expectations at Rush Elementary (Safe, Respectful, Responsible)

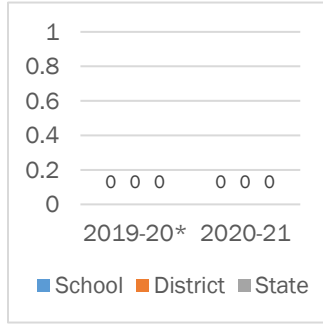

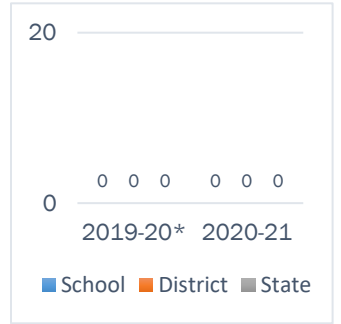
3rd Grade English Language Arts



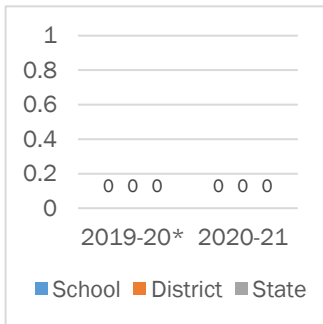
4th Grade English Language Arts



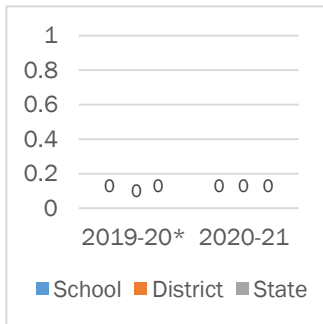
5th Grade English Language Arts



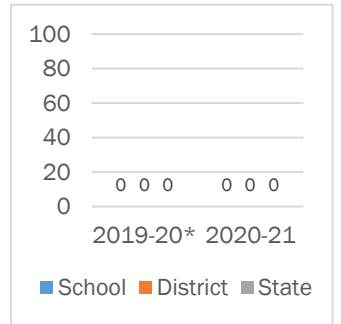
3rd Grade Math



4th Grade Math

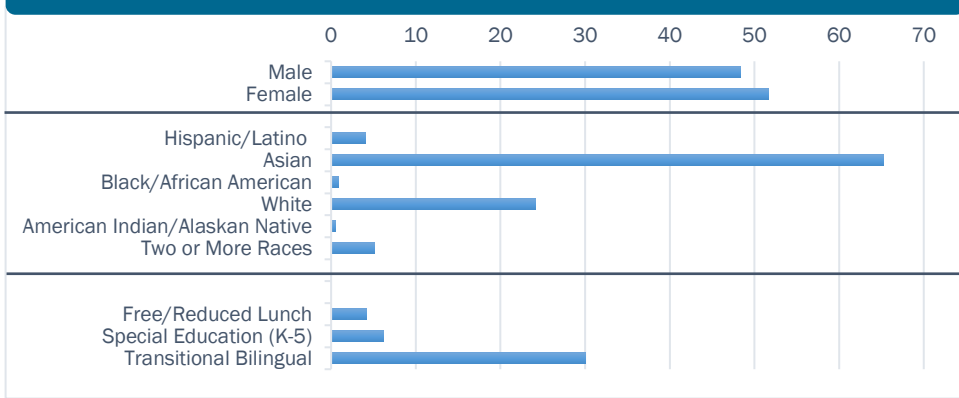


5th Grade Math
